iii- Act as Fox or Lion

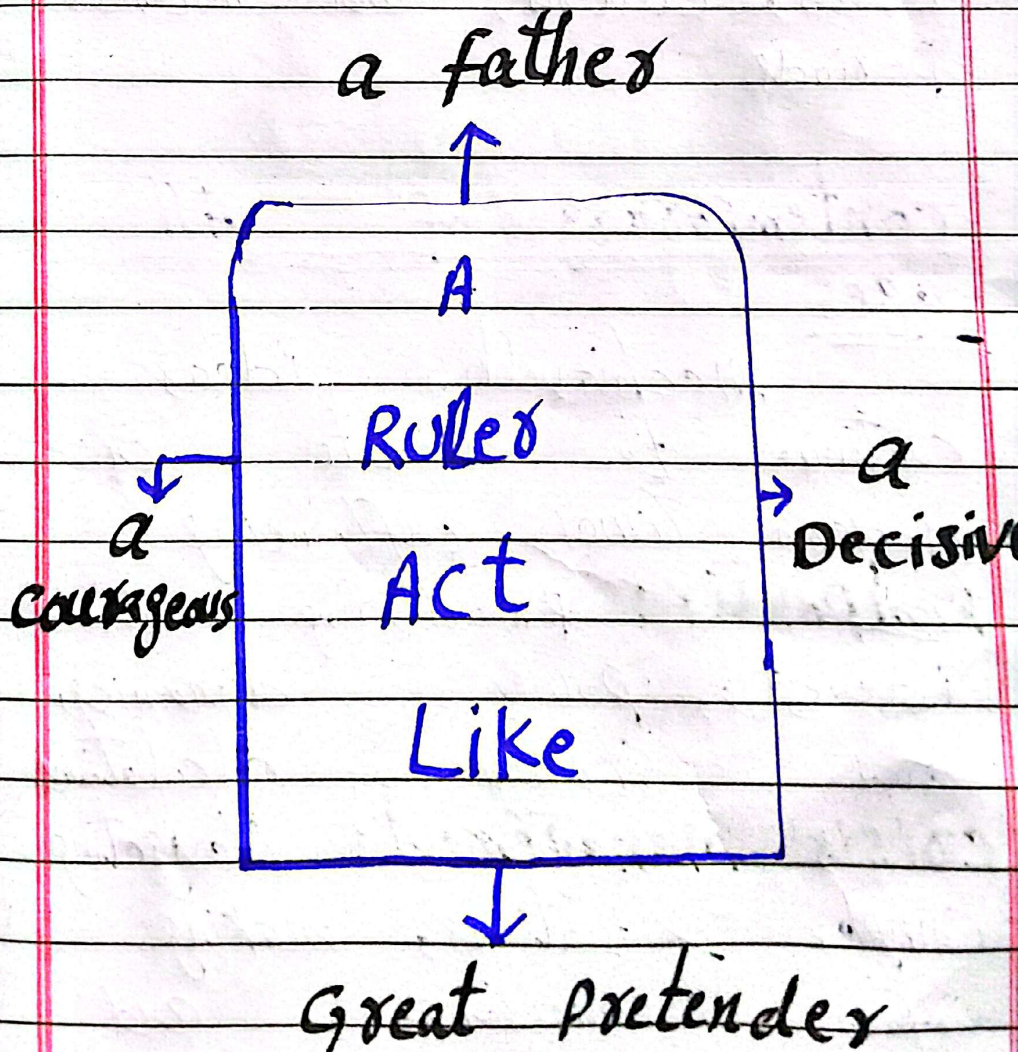
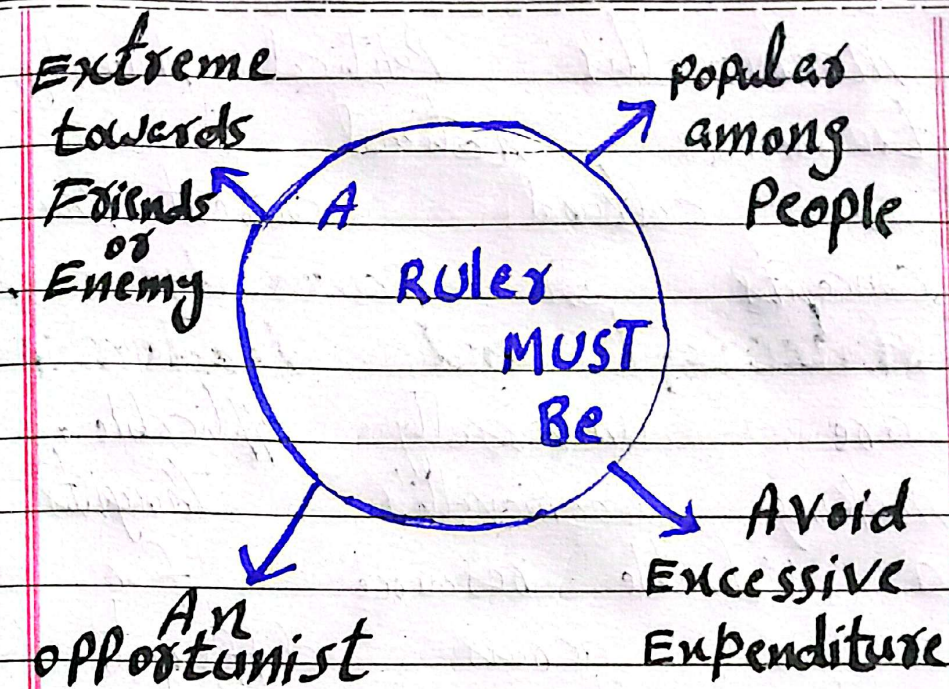
There are two ways of settling the disputes, one is by law and other is by force. Force should be used by acting as brave as lion and as cunning as fox.
