

Trump claims tariff threats prevented India-Pakistan war again

US President Donald Trump has again claimed he stopped a potential war between India and Pakistan using trade pressure. Speaking at a cabinet meeting, he said both countries were close to nuclear conflict. Trump added that he threatened extremely high tariffs to push for peace. He believes his direct warnings made a quick ceasefire possible. Trump has repeated this claim several times in the past.

He described the situation as extremely dangerous, saying fighter jets worth millions were shot down. Trump said he contacted leaders from both countries. He asked them what was going on and warned of severe consequences. He told them no trade deals would happen if war broke out. According to Trump, within five hours of his warning, the conflict cooled.

Trump also said the hatred between India and Pakistan had lasted for centuries. He claimed the situation could restart anytime but promised to stop it again. Trump emphasized his role, saying his fast action stopped further escalation. He warned that trade pressure works better than traditional diplomacy.

India, however, strongly rejected Trump's version of events. Indian officials deny that US pressure led to peace. They have expressed anger at Trump's comments and oppose foreign interference in regional affairs. The country is also unhappy about recent US tariffs on Indian goods.

Pakistan responded differently, welcoming Trump's statement. Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif praised Trump's "leadership" in resolving tensions. He credited US support for helping calm the region. As tensions continue, Trump's remarks are drawing mixed reactions from both sides.

TARIFF THREAT : TRUMP CEASEFIRE CLAIM

US president Donald Trump claims that he stopped the war between India and Pakistan by increasing tariff burden on India. He said in cabinate meeting that both countries were about to escalate nuclear war. His warning made ceasefire possible. Trump described it alarming situation, that millions of dollar jets were downed. By talking to leaders he said that no trade would be done if war happen again. He claimed within five hours the conflict ended and promised to stop again if happen again, he also said, trade pressure weaker better than diplomacy. However, Indian officials opposed the claim of foreign affairs in the region. Also shows aggression on high tariffs on Indian goods and deny the US support in resolving war. But Pakistan's Primeir Shehbaz Sharif opposingly praised Trump leadership for making peaceful ceasefire by crediting him. Amid persistent rivalry both countries have different opinions.
