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Before magna carta, king is absolute authority.

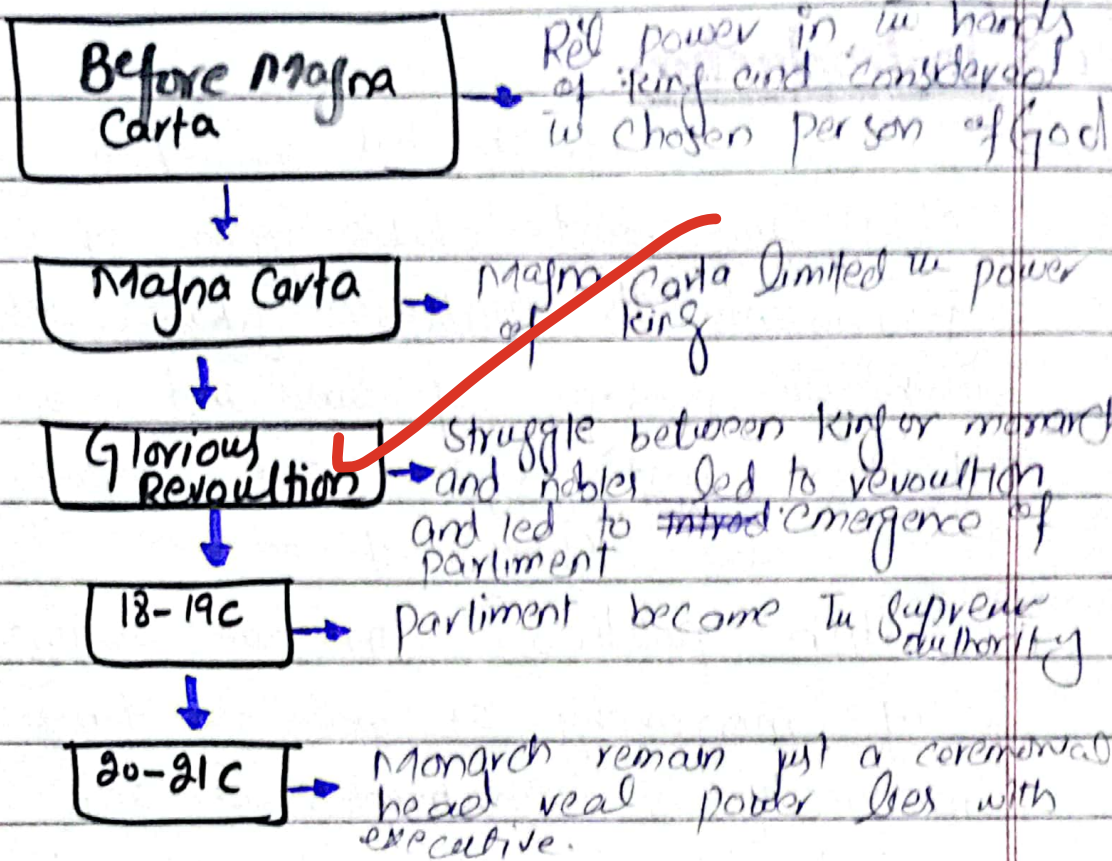


Figure shows how monarchy power evolved with the passage of time.

The king is dead Long live the king:

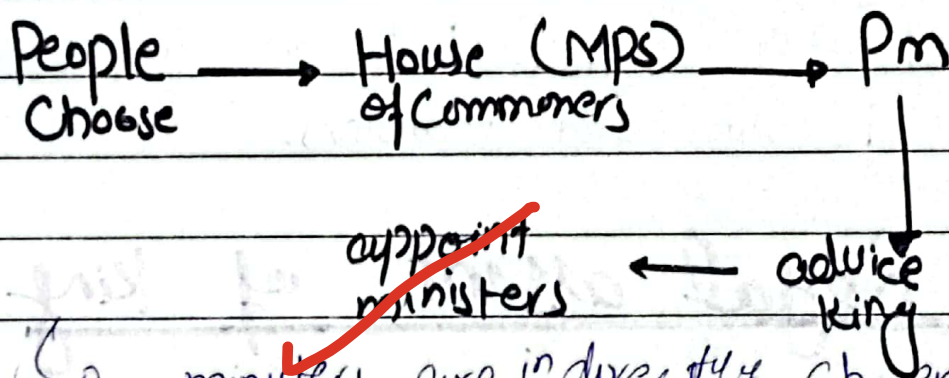
After 20-21 century monarch became a symbol of ceremonial head real power lies in the hands of executive.

Executive power and appointment:

Though king has the executive

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power he has in authority to choose ministers, ambassadors etc., but its a formal appointment, king appoint them in the advice of Pm and Pm is member of House of Commons, who represent in will of people.



So, ministers are indirectly chosen by people through their representative elected mps and pm.

Foreign affairs on advised of ministers

King in Ceremonial head ^{makes} deal foreign dealing, appoint ambassadors to other countries and welcomed in ambassadors of other countries, sign dealings, relations all on in

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advice of ministers who are
in chosen people of public.

Peace and war decisions

Though king is Commander in
Chief of army staff and take
in decisions of war and peace
of any conflict but on the advice
of pm and ministers.

Royal assent of king

If Lower house of legislature pass
a pass, the bill not become a
Parliament act until and unless king
does not sign it, but it's a formality
if king has no right to override
or challenge the bill. If a bill
is passed by Lower house with
simple majority no one has
authority to challenge it even
king or pm cannot stop it.
So, where house of commons are

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representative of public, so they make law according to the will of people.

Electoral System of British Government

In British people have the authority to choose their representative they choose, and their people in house of ~~Commoners~~ are supreme power. King or monarch has no power at all.

Dissolution of Parliament:

Monarch or king has the power to dissolve the legislature but it's a formal power, real power is in the hands of Prime minister, Pm asked King to dissolve it. For example Pm Benjamin of UK once asked Queen Elizabeth to dissolve

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in parliament in order to
reelection.

Vote of no Confidence:

The chosen people of public
like the house of commons
has authority to question executive
body like ministers and PM,
if they found something suspicious
or ~~with~~ against public interest so,
they have the right to pass
a bill or vote of no confidence
against PM. This shows the real
democracy that lies in the hands
of people.

Flexibility of UK Constitution and democracy.

The UK Constitution is flexible
in nature and house of
commons has authority to
amend it easily without

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any difficult procedure. House of Commons will use the will of people and amend the Constitution.

For example in 1948, 1949 House of Commons present an act to limit the power of House of Lords, who are Clergy and nobles and do ^{according to} their own interest. So, house of commons means public has limit their authority.
