Donald Trump visited Qatar, Saudi Arabia and Dubai in May 2025, after which these countries invested in USA but still ~~want~~ DC prioritizes Israel over its economic allies. Moreover, Saudi Arabia like other middle east Countries only rely on USA for security alliances. Although there is no written agreement between Middle east countries and USA but these countries trusted USA to be their military allies. Which gave ready check to middle east ~~that~~ especially Saudi Arabia that USA is the only security and military alliance of Saudi Arabia prioritizes Israel.

#### 2.3. Pakistan as the Only declared Nuclear Muslim Country.

### 4.1. Military Implications:
