## II: Understanding the Importance of Chahbahar Port with respect to Sino-Iranian Strategic Cooperation Pact: A troublesome reality for American policy makers:

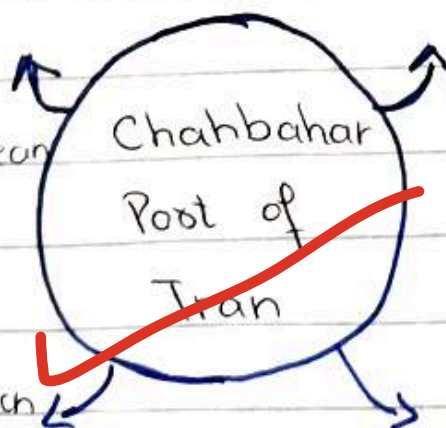
Iran's only oceanic port, providing direct access to Arabian Sea and Indian Ocean

Located near strait of Hormuz - a critical oil

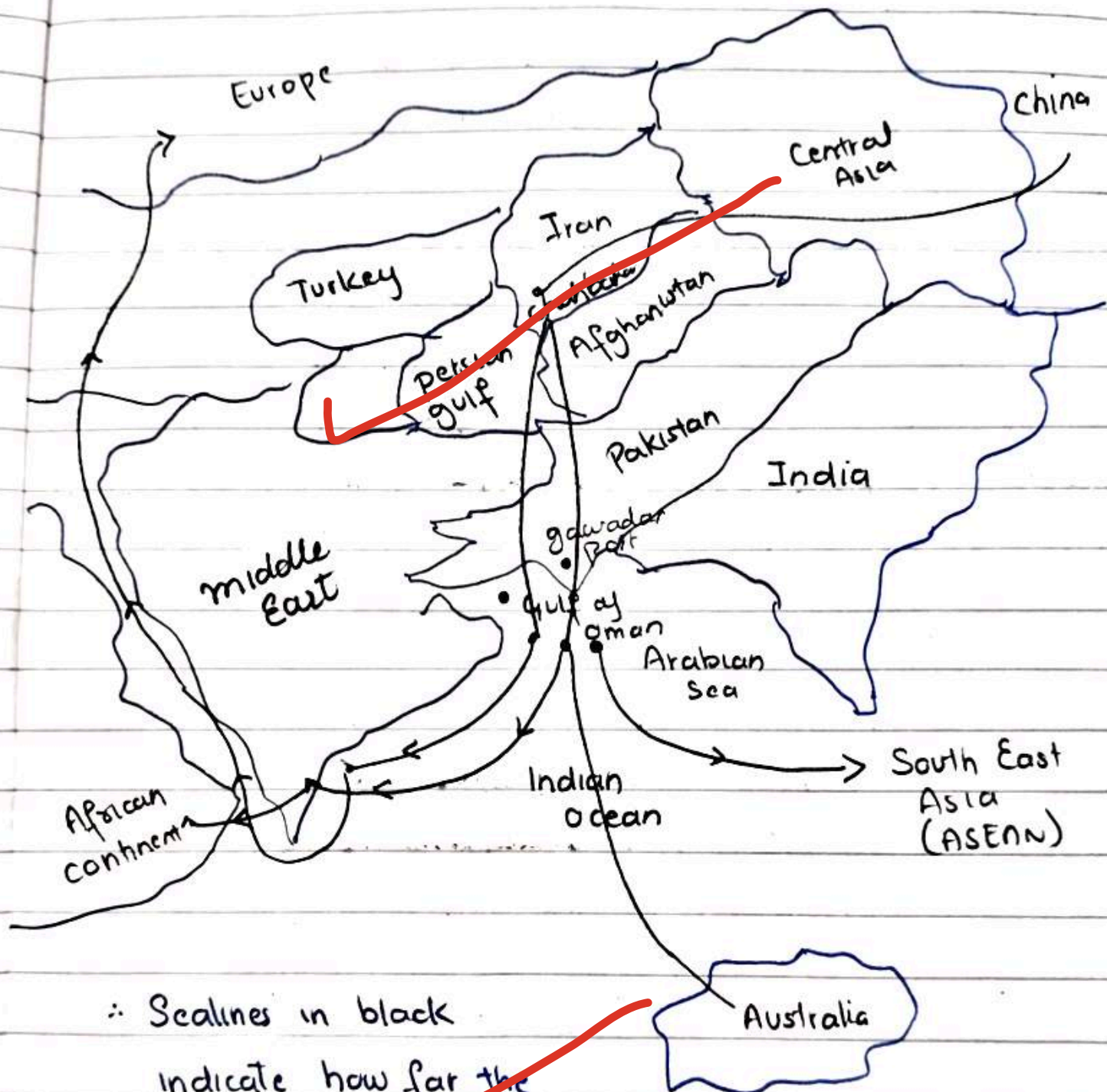
Shipping choke point

Connects Iran with Africa, Europe, Australia and far East Asia



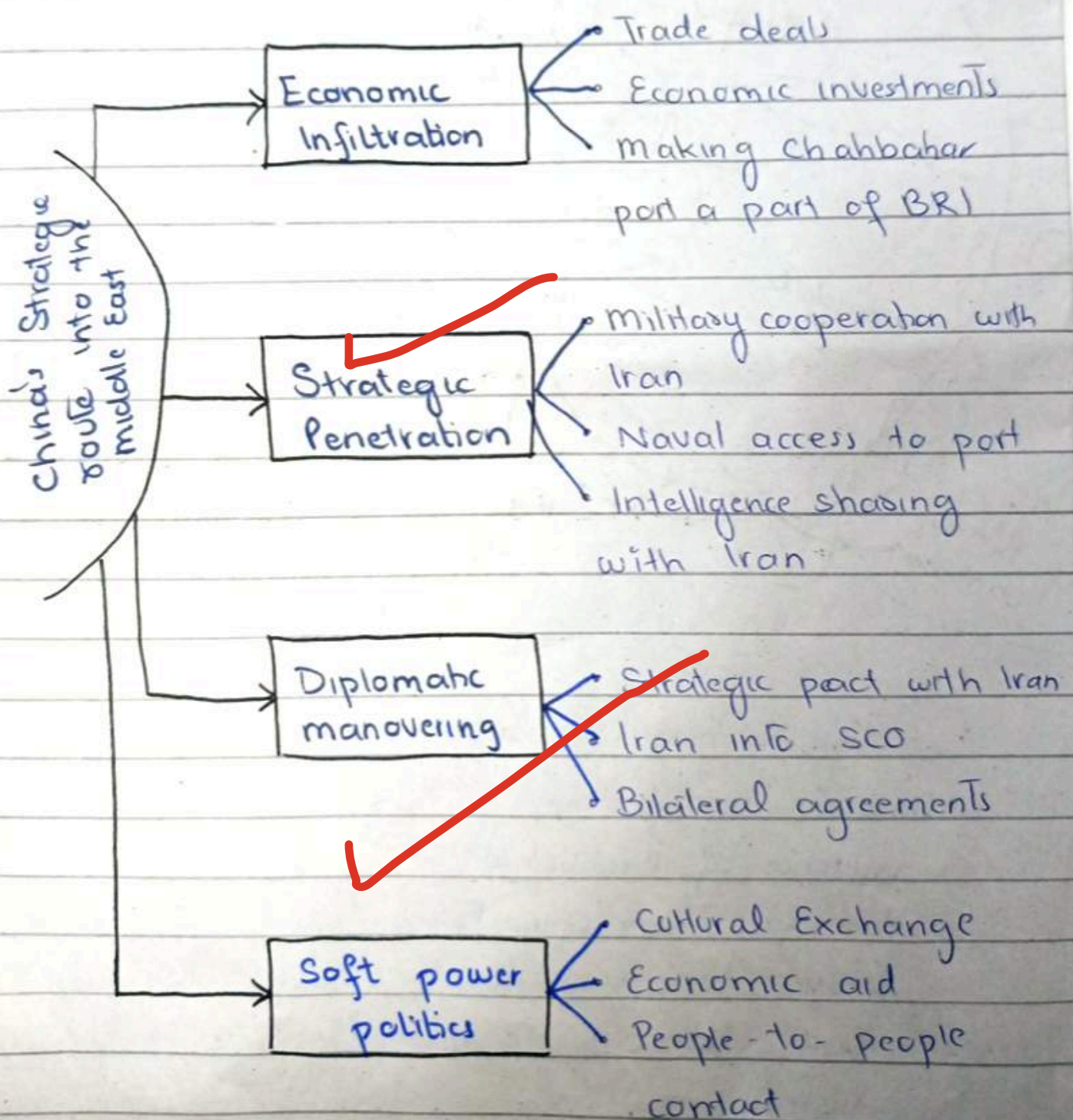

∴ Sealines in black indicate how far the influence of Chahbahar Port goes, from China to Europe, to Africa, to Asia and cross to Australia



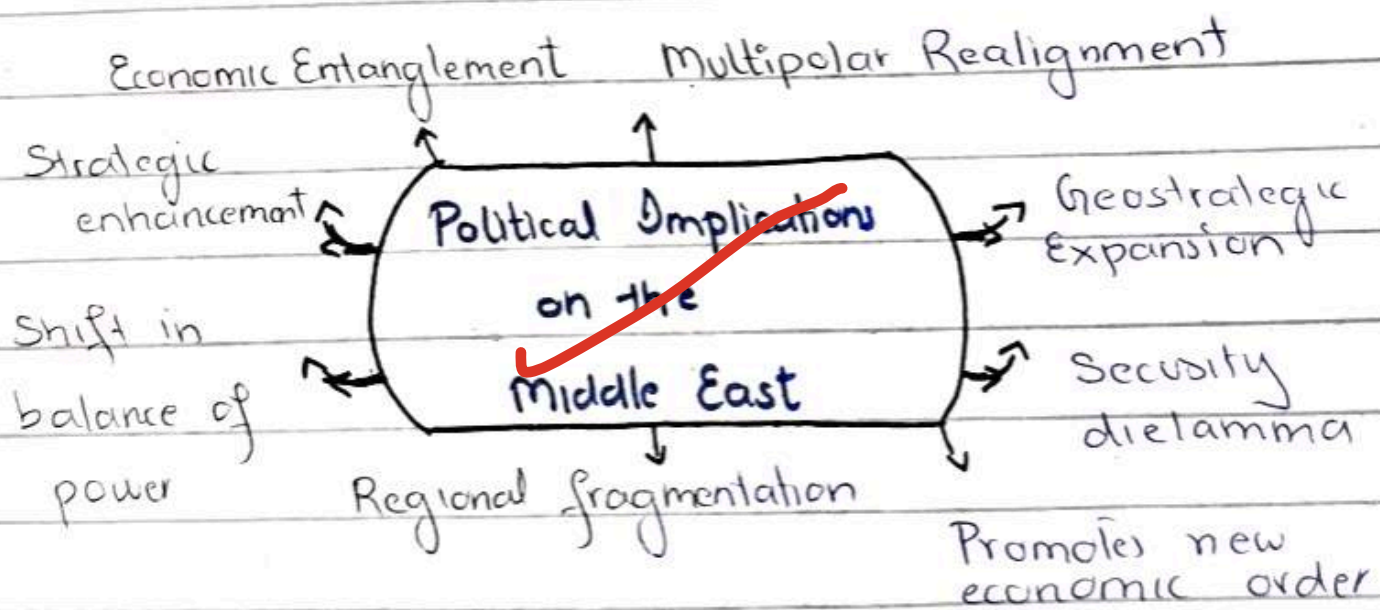
