I INTRODUCTION.

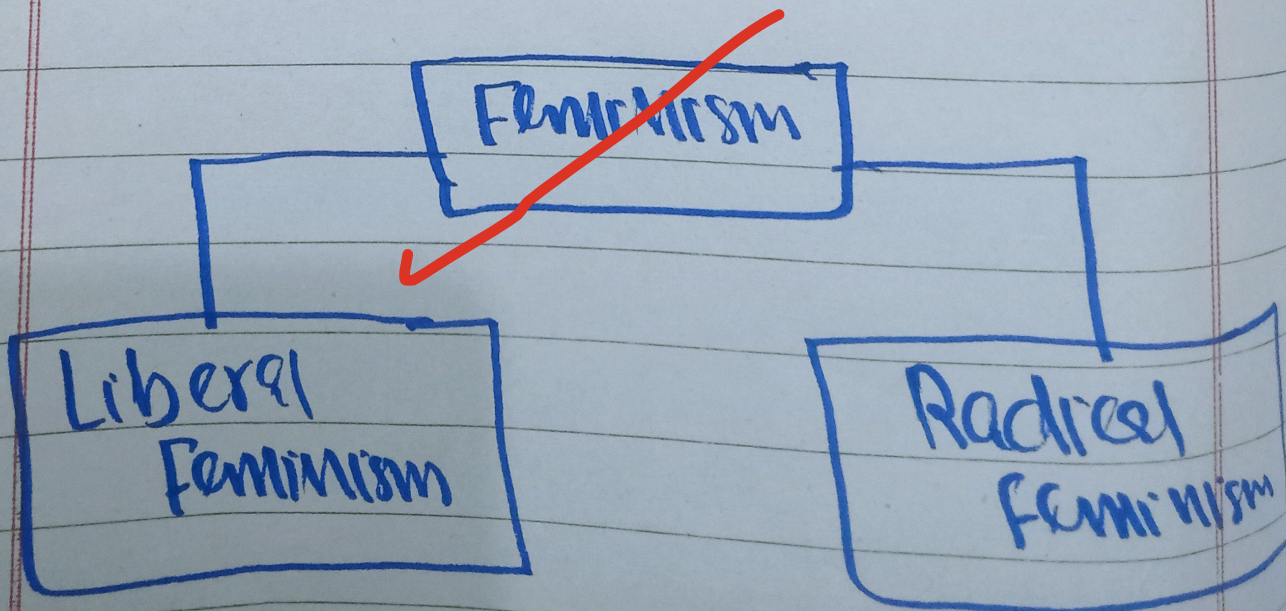
Feminism is a radical notion that women are human beings.
