across the truth when there is media full of fake personalities and fake emotions. When the emotions and feelings are being sold at the cost of likes and comments on social media, truth is very rare. When digital media becomes a tool to satisfy one's ego, it will definitely curbs the efforts to find truth.

Moreover, spread of a bunch of lies in cover of half truth is another challenge in finding out truth in current age. This essay sheds light on how information is weaponized and used as misinformation while acknowledging that truth is difficult to find in the age of digital media.

Discussing the battle of finding truth in digital era, it must be discussed that people do not even show their true colors on social media. They remain constantly in touch with their friends on social media, but in pretended manner. Social media is a platform where people come to pretend their fake personalities and



hide their originality. For the same reason, they tend to interact only on social media. A Meta survey of 2023 found out that 73% of their respondents said they want to continue their interaction on social media. Only 12% respondents showed their desire to meet in person with their online friends. It highlights how fake personalities portrayed by social media is a hurdle towards originality.

Secondly, human emotions are commodified on social media. It looks like someone is hurt, but it turns out the commodification of emotions and feelings in actual. People share their stories just for the sake of likes, comments and promotions of their profiles. Moreover, it has been observed that people also gain financial gains on sharing their emotional moments even though they are not real. For instance, a case of Punjab is a best illustration where one Youtube vlogger has shared his father's funeral video, depicting the commodification of emotions through social media.



Thirdly, it has been observed that people use digital media to frame others in criminal activities, satisfying their egos. It is more prevalent in developing countries where forensic laws are not strong enough. Many people become victim of this trap, as their rivals manage to get revenge this way. For instance, it is common observation that many cases of blasphemy are falsely registered in Pakistan. A very famous case of 15 year old girl, who was accused of blasphemy, later released by court, shows the power of misinformation curtailing the truth.

Another manifestation of prevalent misinformation in the age of digital media is fake viral incidents on social media. These viral incidents affects the overview of general public toward that specific issue. When <sup>any viral incident</sup> it turns out fake, the confusion has been spread among public. It becomes a challenge to curtail this evil in age of misinformation. For example, false news by some
