Justice is the highest virtue that ensures wisdom, courage, and temperance, function in balance.

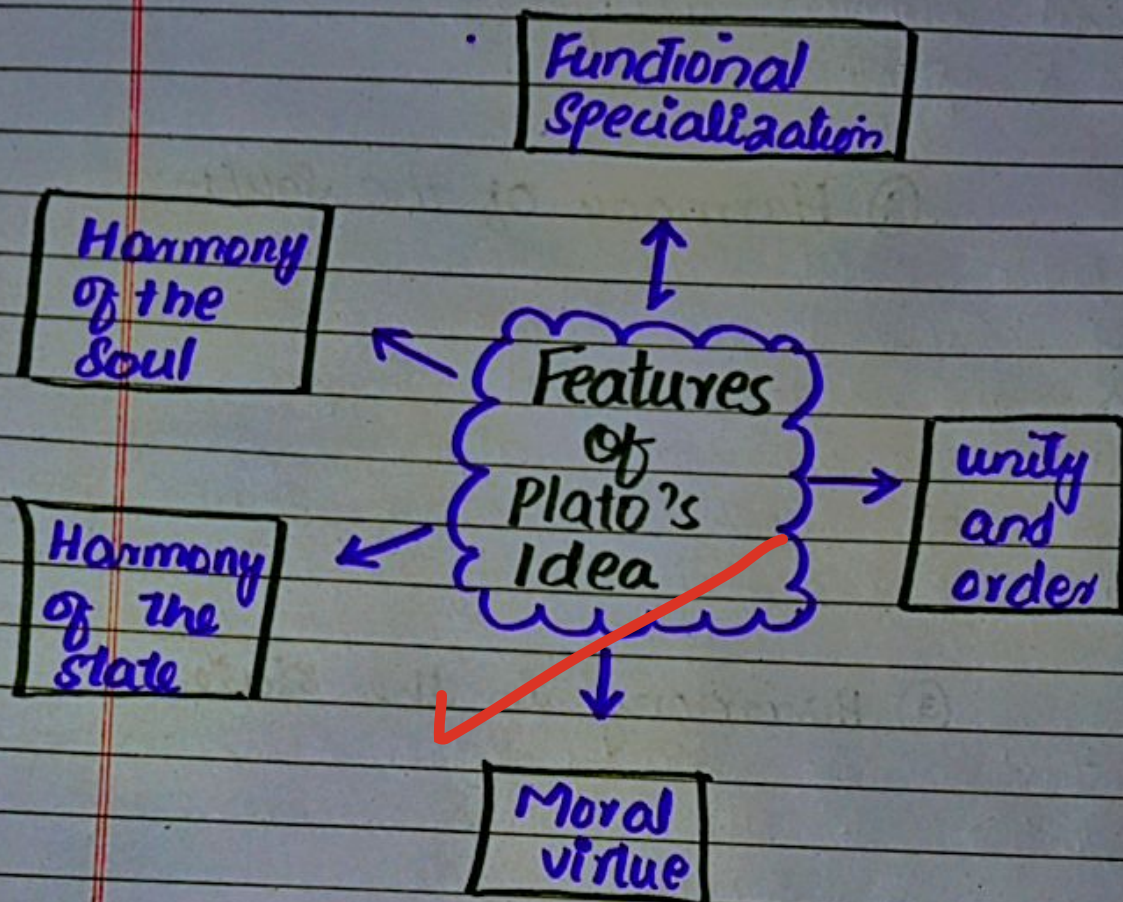
⑤ Unity and order:-

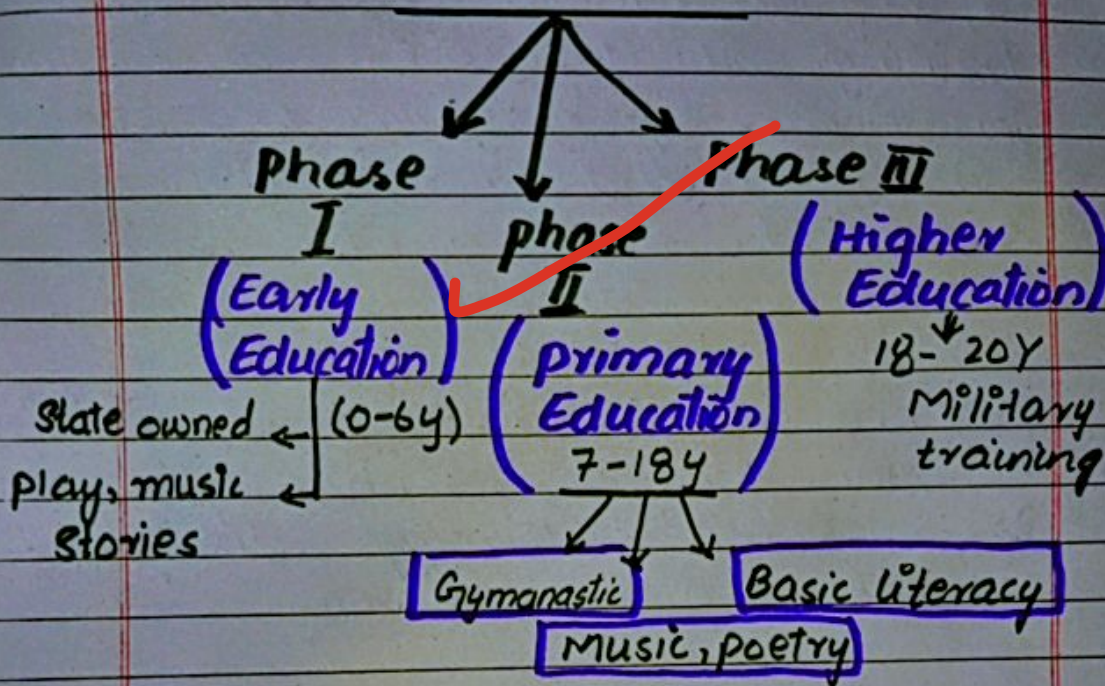

Plato's Education System



Phase I:- Early Education

Plato believed that education begins at birth and should be state-controlled. During this phase, children learn through play, music, and stories. The purpose is to shape their character, emotions, and morals rather than their intellect. He emphasized that early impression deeply affects the soul, so only moral tales and harmonious music

should be allowed.

Phase II : Primary Education

In this stage the focus shifts to Physical, moral, and intellectual training. It includes gymnastics for body, poetry and music for soul, and basic literacy for mind. Plato aimed to develop balance - a strong, disciplined body and a refined, self-controlled mind. The plan was to prepare citizens for civic life through discipline, courage, and harmony.

Phase III : Higher Education (18-20).

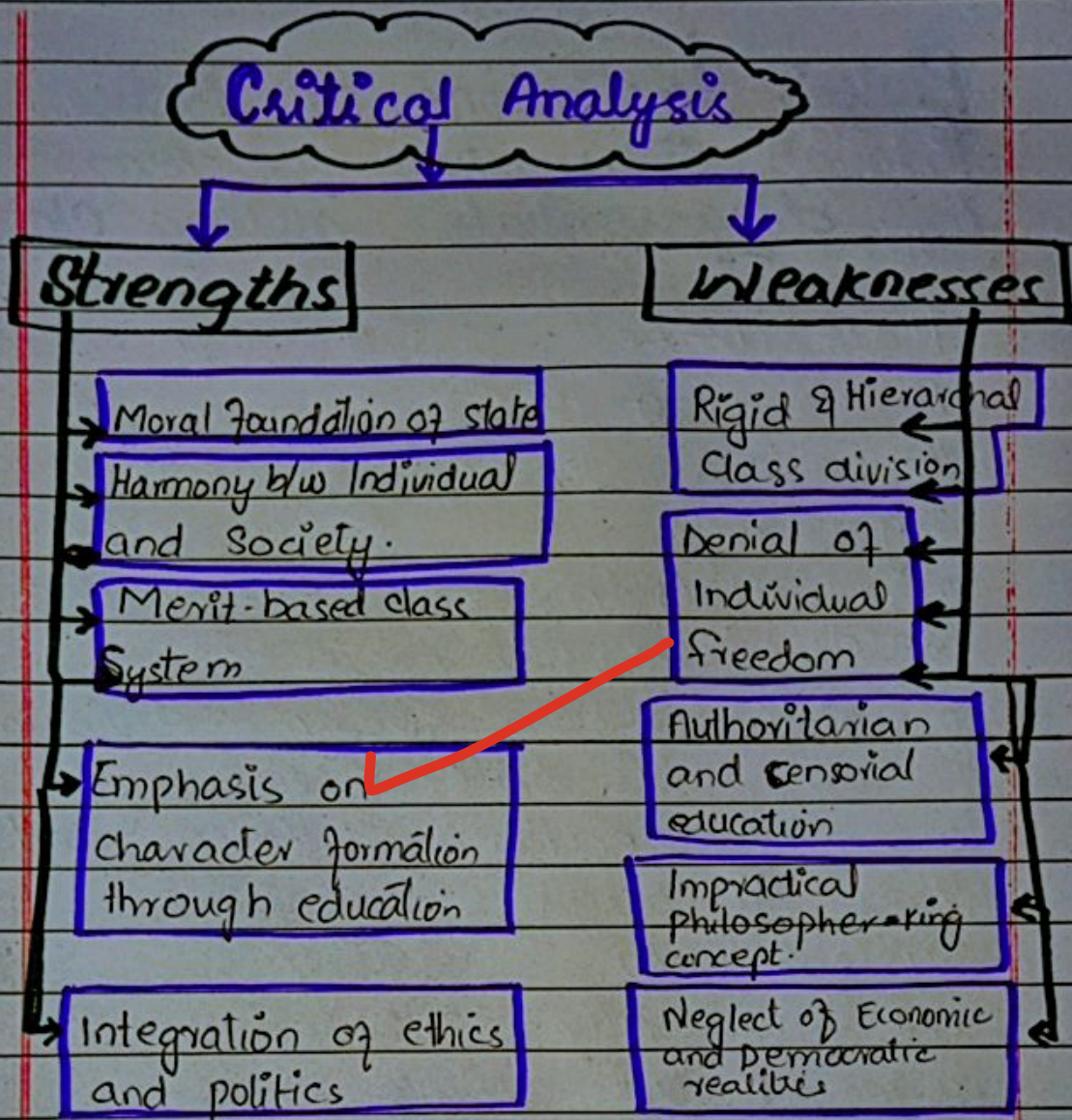
This phase begins after physical and moral formation. Plato prescribed military training to instill bravery, obedience and patriotism. It prepared the young adults for public duty and leadership. After 20 years, merely the capable and the wised would continue to philosophical and mathematical studies in the Academy, leading eventually to the education of the philosopher-king.

Plato's Implications of Justice Through Education System To differentiate ruling class:

Plato connects justice with education by arguing that harmony of the state depends on well organized system of learning and division of class among state. For him, justice prevails when every individual performs his role according to his credibility. He argued that, through rigorous system of training, individuals are gradually filtered and differentiated into class. Those who show wisdom, rationality, and intellectual strength are educated further to become rulers. In this way, education ensures that leadership is not based on wealth but on merit. He believed justice is achieved when ruling class is composed of most virtuous and knowledgeable minds.



Conclusion:

Plato's theory connects justice and education to create a balanced and a moral society. His focus on harmony and merit gives strength to the state, but the strict class division and limited freedom make his ideas less practical. Still, his vision reminds us that a just society begins with educated and virtuous individuals.
