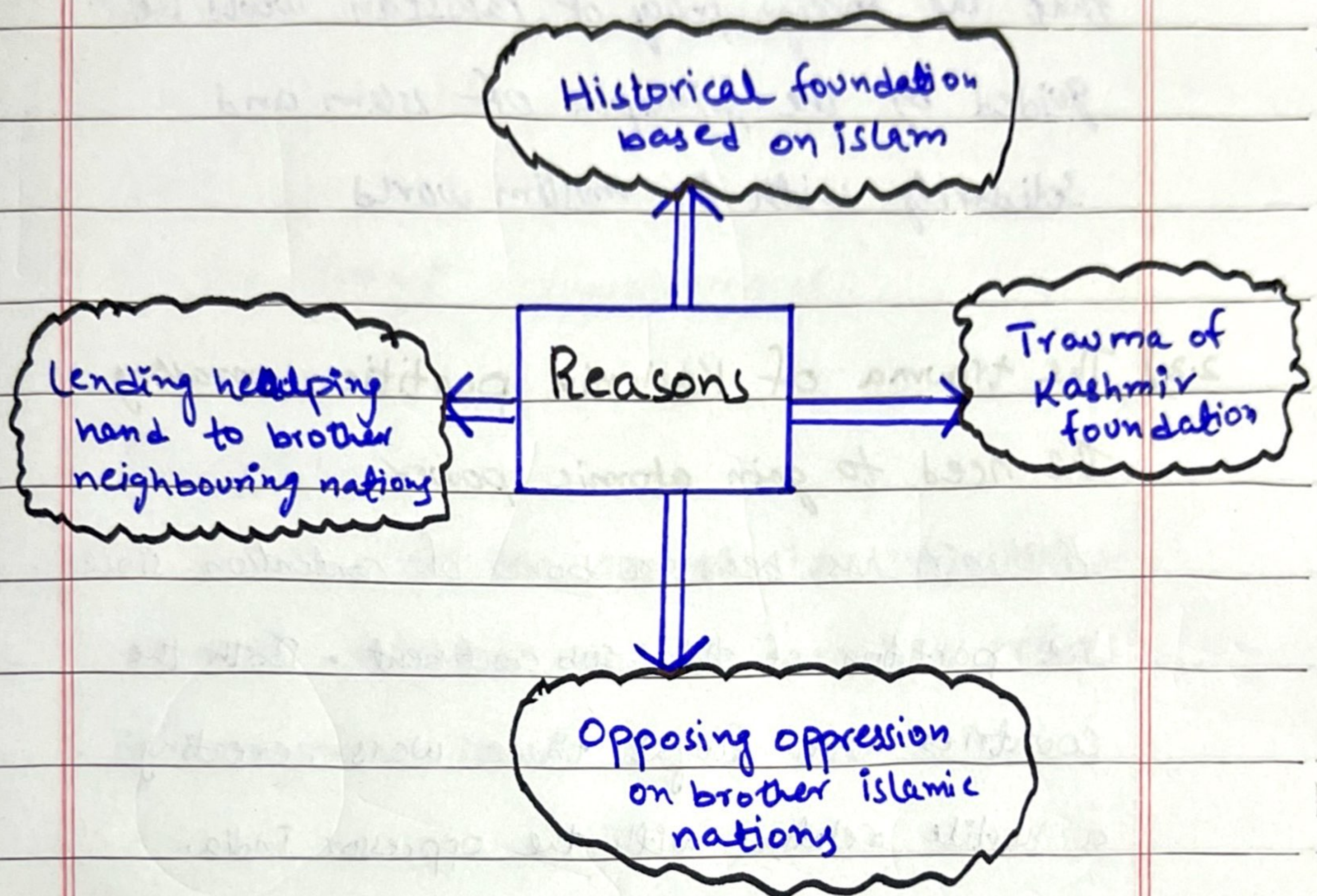

This was due to historical foundation based on Islam, trauma of Kashmir separation, opposing the oppression in Gaza etc.

The impacts of this have positive aspects in the form of attaining the atomic bomb, and Islamic diplomacy gains. But it also gives rise to a few repercussions such as internal instability and fluctuating relations with great powers.

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2) Why did Pakistan prefer emotions, feelings and ideology in its foreign policy



2.1) Historical foundation based on Islam:

Providing an Islamic lens to the foreign policy
Pakistan was formed on the basis of
Islamic ideology. The Muslims of subcontinent
needed a ~~sp~~ separate homeland where Islamic
beliefs should be at the pinnacle. This enabled
the foreign policy of Pakistan to create strong
relations with Islamic countries.

2.2) The trauma of Kashmir partition making the need to gain atomic power

Kashmir has been a bone of contention since the partition of the sub continent. Both the countries have fought three wars, creating a hostile relation with the oppressor India.

After the Smiling Buddha, Pakistan ~~feelt~~ felt threatened. This forced Pakistan to get its own atomic weapon giving birth to a defensive foreign policy with India.

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2.3) Opposing the oppression on brother Islamic nation by rejecting ~~the~~ Israel as a nation

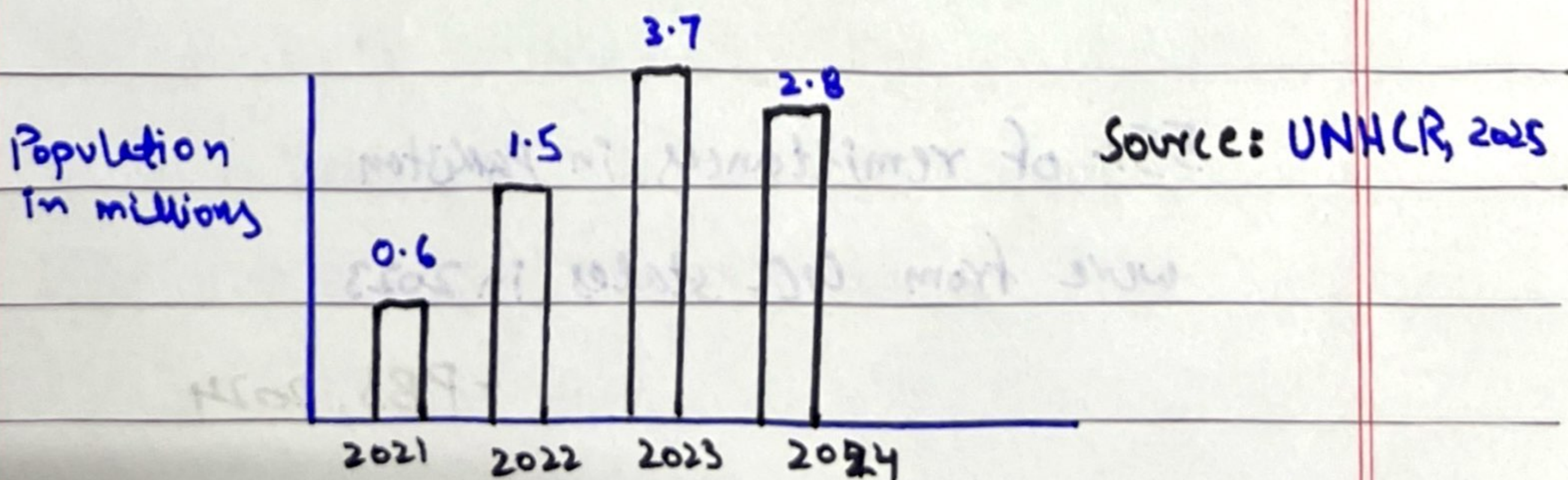
Pakistan's foreign policy displays a feeling of empathy with the Palestinians. It has always stood against the atrocities being committed by the illegal occupier Israel

Pakistan's foreign policy towards Afghanistan is an emotional one. It has granted for refugees to settle in Pakistan to live a peaceful life.

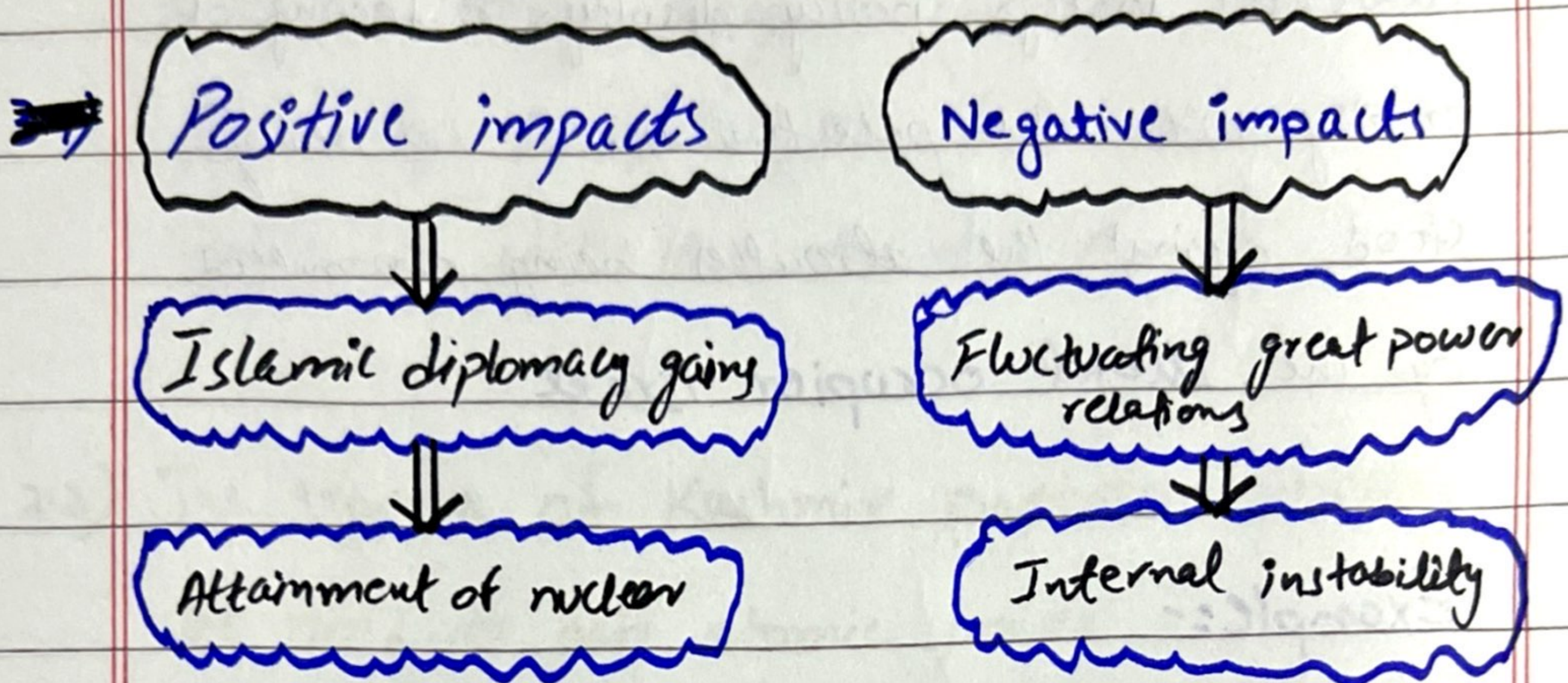


Description: The following graph shows influx of ^{Afghan} refugees in Pakistan

3.1) Positive impacts

(a) Islamic diplomacy gains granting financial aid through GCC states

Through Islamic ideology Pakistan has gained Islamic diplomacy via its foreign policy. It has maintained stable and friendly ties which has led to the granting of financial aid as well as other economic perks.

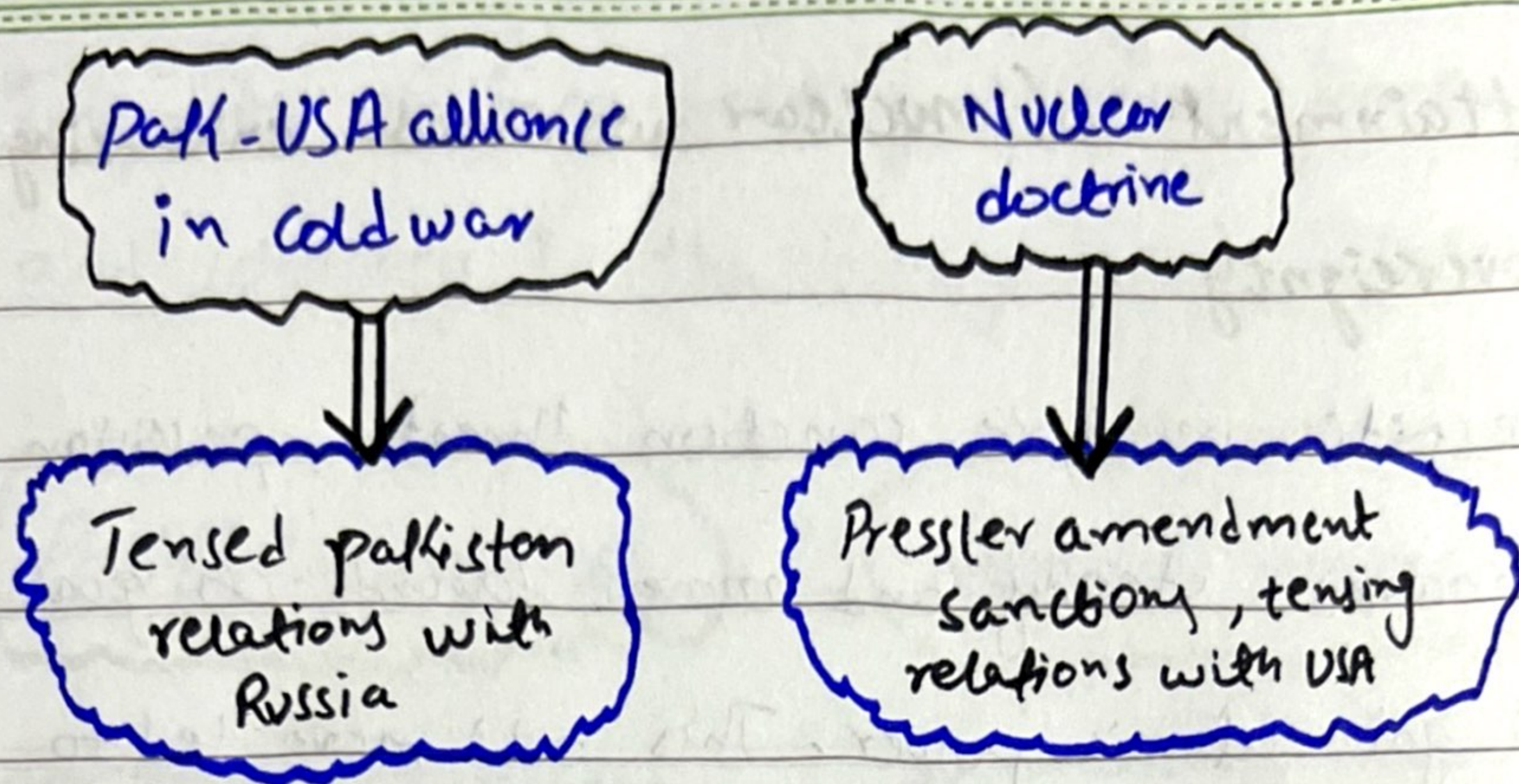
3.2) Negative impacts

a) Fluctuating relations with great powers

The volatility in Pakistan's foreign policy led to fluctuating relations with the great power around the globe. This caused ~~loss~~ loss of trust, sanctions and weakened global image.

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b) Internal instability due to Afghan refugee spill over
