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Secondly, the government should allocate sufficient budget to improve the infrastructure of higher educational institutions. Campuses must be designed to be accessible to all, especially persons with disabilities, by providing ramps and elevators. Green Spaces should be included for aesthetics as well as for academic and non-academic activities. Higher educational institutes should also possess modern, well-equipped laboratories and research centers so that students can gain hands-on experience alongside theoretical knowledge. In addition to modern facilities, the campus environment must be hygienic, especially the food served in the Cafeterias. For instance, in Dec 2021, a number of students^{of Karachi University} suffered food poisoning due to unhygienic food in the Cafeterias and had to be hospitalized. Such situations can be avoided by forming inspection teams and imposing heavy fines if Cafeterias are found guilty of negligence. To ensure safety, Surveillance Cameras should also be installed in key areas of the university for security and monitoring purposes. Moreover, first aid services must be available on Campus to

deal with any emergency. A tragic example occurred in Frontier Medical College when Abu Zar, a very bright student, fainted during a lecture. Unfortunately, the college lacked a working ECG machine and no immediate first aid was given. Upon reaching Ayub Hospital, the young man lost his life. Such incidents highlight the urgent need to strengthen infrastructure in higher education institutions so that students are provided with a safe, healthy and supportive environment.
