It awares the women about the consequences of early marriages, exploitation and gender disparities. Additionally, education promotes awareness among women about health, family planning and participation in civic —



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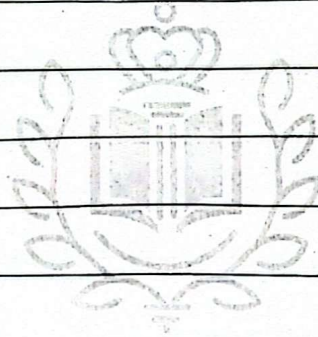
