Pakistan's education system has remained fail to reap the potential of its youth due to several

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Barriers - The first and foremost is the lack of political will in policy implementation. More than 25 education policies including national education policy of 2009 have been formulated, but none have been implemented in true and genuine spirit due to corruption, lawlessness and inconsistency on the part of successive political regimes. Thus, lack of policy implementation has caused the failure of education system.

Besides, finance is considered the engine of the system. The education system of Pakistan has crippled mainly due to scarcity of funds. The successive governments have been spending less than 4 percent of its GDP on education sector.

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According to International Crises

Group, Pakistan is among 12 countries that spend less than 2 percent of their budget on education system. This budgetary allocation is very insufficient to meet the ~~ci~~ needs of education system in present changing time.

Furthermore, In whole, lack of finance is the major cause behind poor education system of Pakistan.

Furthermore, several education system are working simultaneously in the country, making it difficult for rural children to compete with urban students in job market. Along with it, there is a clear difference between

the students^{attitude} coming out from
public schools, Deeni Madaris and
a few elite private schools. The

The increasing wave of terrorism
and ~~int~~ sectarianism is the
consequence of this divided system.

Thus, non-uniform education system
further aggravate the already
weak education system.

Similarly, there is a lack of
techno-vocational institutes which
confronts the economic arena of
the country. According to Planning
Commission of Pakistan, only
6 percent students takes vocational
education and just 2 percent
of them implement it in their
life. Techno-vocational education
is indispensable to compete with

the emerging trends of the world and to boost the entrepreneurship. But Pakistan's education system lags behind in this realm. Thus, lack of techno-vocational institutions has led toward poor education system.

Likewise, training is very necessary for quality performance in teaching as ~~teach~~ it is a challenging job. But in Pakistan, there are a few training centres most of which have been closed due to scarcity of funds and trained human resources. According to UNESCO, there are no proper training standards ~~is~~ available.

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in training centres of remote areas of Punjab, Sindh, KPK and Balochistan. The courses taught in the training centres are so updated that they do not cater to the needs of modern world. Therefore, inept ~~edu~~ training contributes nothing to teachers and as a result to students.

Nonetheless, there is always a light at the end of dark tunnel. Pakistan's youth can be turned into diamond by educating them, how they deserve to be. There is a dire need to reverse our education system, so to align the country in the line of developed countries. The

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government should take concrete steps to improve the system. At first, finance should be raised.

Majority of the Pakistan's schools lack infrastructure, modern tools and labs and other basic necessities. There should be atleast 4 percent budget budgetry allocation for education system. So, that it may take fresh breath with resources.

Secondly, there should be modern and update syllabus. For this purpose, a vast survey can be conducted to seek the aspirations of parents, teachers and students.

Moreover, education goals should also be redefined.

Thirdly, there should be no delay

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in policy implementation. There should be less to no political interference to help the system work smoothly.

Government should set some educational goals and kept it revising with changing time.

Lastly, there is dire need to revitalize the teaching process.

of teachers so that they may work efficiently - "Hire well,
