Role of Early Warning Systems

In Disaster Risk Reduction

The severity of damage caused by disasters can be reduced by early warning systems. There were many disasters in the world whose adverse impacts were coped up by the help of early warning systems. The early warning systems are helpful in a number of ways. First it will sensitize people for the upcoming disaster and make them alert and prepared. Moreover, it will save people from psychological trauma caused by the havoc of disasters. It reduces the death toll and people along with their belongings can be shifted to safer places. So, they can survive before provided with aid. The importance of early warning systems is depicted in the low death toll of 525 people in Chile Earthquake and Tsunami in year 2010. While in the absence of early warning system, an earthquake of exactly same magnitude of 8.8 in Colombia in ^{year} 1906 caused almost 1500 deaths. In this way, early warning system reduce disaster risks and death tolls.
