↳ Alaska summit 2025:

In August 2025, a bilateral summit was held between presidents of two global powers. Ever since the ~~war~~ started, it was the first visit of Russia's president Valdimir Putin to U.S. The meeting was held to discuss the on-going war in Ukraine and practical implications to end the war.

↳ Result of the meeting:



• Russia's maximization of demands:
