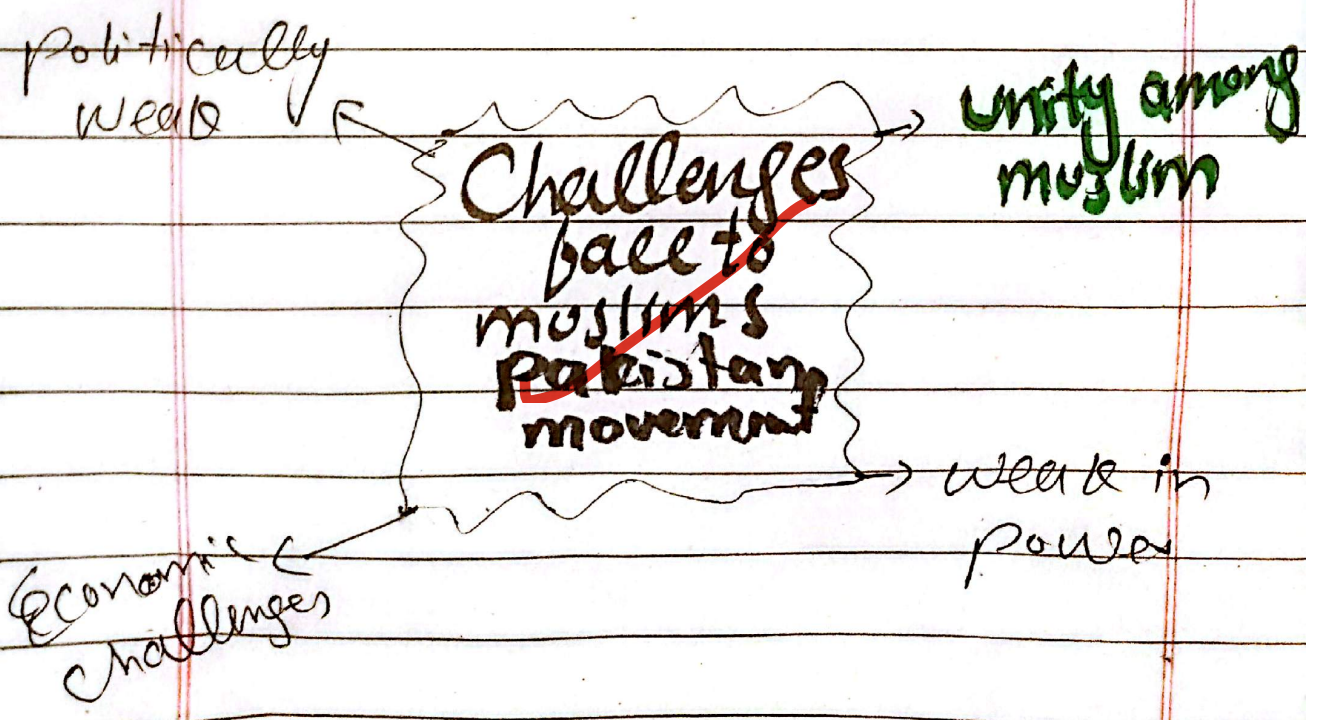
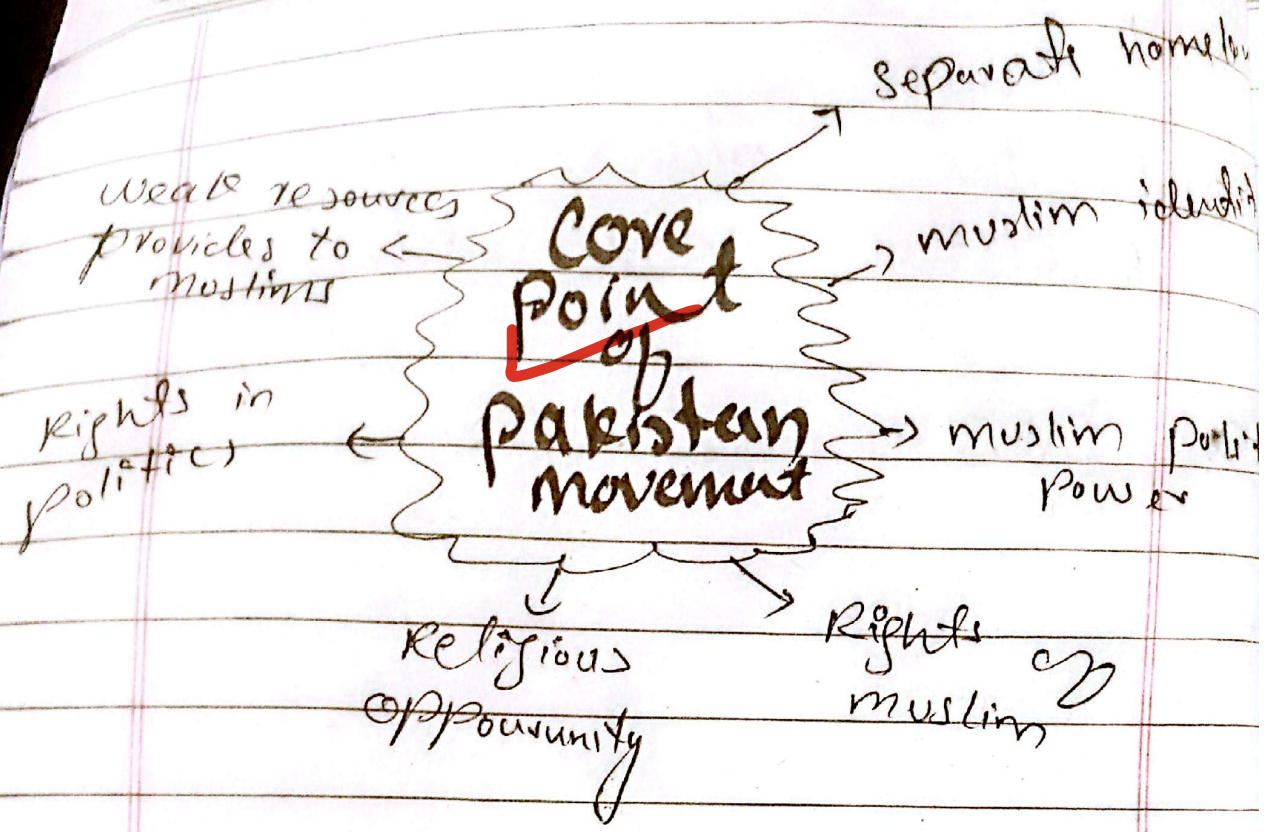


Evaluate the role of the separate electorate system in the evolution of the Pakistan movement.
