

But this evolution of democracy was through a mass literacy campaigns. With no or low political literacy, there is a lack of political awareness. The people will not be aware of the power of votes as that it could change the system and ~~upgrade~~ upgrade the system. As in democracy, majority is authority, so if the majority is politically illiterate, the ultimate

result would be the unsui' generis democracy and finally the government. In many democratic countries the system collapsed because of the lack of political awareness in people and they chose the wrong, ~~and~~ corrupt and unsuitable representatives which results in political instabilities in able systems.
