Who can forget the story of Iqbal Masih, a child sold into bonded labor for less than seven dollars? Despite overwhelming odds, he resisted the system that exploited him. He joined the Bonded Labor Liberation Front and travelled nationally and internationally to raise awareness against child labor. Dreaming of becoming lawyer, his life was tragically cut short at the age of twelve by the very forces he fought against.

The UN General Assembly on June 12, 2015 passed resolution - Global Efforts towards the Elimination of Child Labor - for eradicating child

labor by 2025. However, according to International Labor Organization and UNICEF, nearly 130 million children are engaged in child labor and 48 million among these are in hazardous work. The persistence of child labor is attributed to the poverty and bonded labor. In addition to this, in agrarian economies, like Pakistan, it is induced by intergenerational occupational inheritance. Moreover, child labor is overshadowed by the security dilemmas and climate change. Furthermore, governance crisis aggravates it. Consequently, it has adverse impacts on children's mental and physical health. Nonetheless, NGOs and IGOs are essential for countering child labor.
