Q# 2

Challenges to Unity and Revolution in Pakistan

Amos Lieven in "Pakistan: A Hard Country," describes the numerous factors that could disrupt the discipline and unity of Pakistani soldiers, faced with the moral and emotional pressures. Lieven suggests that the only thing that can bring about as far as the army as a whole is concerned is if the US were to invade part of Pakistan, and the army command failed to give orders to resist this. Already Pakistani state to US demands has already caused moral issues to fight back against US incursions.

Lieven highlights that if the army splinters and radicalizes, it could lead to Islamist upheaval and the collapse of the state. However, it would likely result in rebellion and civil war similar to Iran. He also emphasizes the complex nature of Pakistani identity. Ali Masani, a Lahore executive

supports this perspective, highlighting the divisions in Palestinian society on basis of overlapping identities, that create obstacles to national cohesion.
