Precis

In Pakistan a Moral Country, Lieven warns that powerful moral pressures could shatter Pakistani soldiers' unity. If they're torn between defending Pakistan and obeying commanders during a US invasion, discipline might break. Subversion to the US has already hit morale. Soldiers admit parts might rebel against US troops, splitting the army. This could lead to Islamist turmoil and state collapse. However, unlike Iran's successful revolution, Pakistan might face civil war. Lieven notes regional identity's rise in politics from the 2008 elections, but Pakistan's complex layers of identity hinder unity. Islamists and some soldiers have singular identities, unlike others. Even

Question no. 03
