Question #3

Q1. Guderian exhibited a natural talent as a commander during the Blitzkrieg campaigns, marked by his initiative, leading from front, and a readiness to challenge peers who obstructed his path. He introduced the tank as an operative weapon to the Army, favouring a strategic use of panzer forces that involved deep thrusts into enemy territory.

Q2. Guderian's disagreement with Hitler arose during the attack on Soviet Union in 1941, when the German army was cut off and trapped, Guderian advocated for abandoning the position and transposing the army across the Baltic Sea. Hitler opposed to authorizing retreat, disagreed with this suggestion, leading to heated confrontation between the two.

Q3. Guderian offensive tactics involved the strategic use of panzer forces for deep penetrations into enemy territory. He pushed forward without excessive concern for his own flanks, aiming to surprise his adversaries. He planned to

transport all supporting elements (infantry, artillery, engineers) alongside the tank core on tracks, integrating supply services to sustain his forces for several days.

Q4 Guderian's relief from command proved beneficial in hindsight as it prevented him from becoming involved in war crimes, which had affected many of other German generals. Being relieved from command saved Guderian from potential complicity in such actions during later stages of the war.

Q5. If Guderian had not been relieved from his command, he might have continued to serve active roles within the military, potentially being associated with decisions and actions that occurred during the latter stages of WWII, including war crimes. His relief spared him from such involvement and the subsequent consequences.

Question # 2

Title:

Unity Amidst Diversity: Challenges and Complexities of Pakistan's Identity.

In 'Pakistan A Hard Country', Anatol Lieven looks at how well Pakistan's military sticks together. He says that only if Pakistani soldiers face strong pressures against their duty to Pakistan and their commanders might their unity break. This could happen if the US attacks and the army ~~could~~ does not resist. Soldiers already feel bad about obeying the US too much. They think that if the US attacks, parts of the Pakistan army might rebel to fight back. But this could split and make the army extreme, causing problems and maybe even a collapse. This wouldn't be like Iran's revolution but more like fighting inside Pakistan. Lieven also talks about how people in different parts of Pakistan vote differently. Pakistan's mix of identities can make things complex. Some groups like Islamists and soldiers have one strong identity, but not everyone does. For instance in Lahore, if someone wants big change, people might not follow them because of their backgrounds. Lieven shows that Pakistan's unity isn't simple and needs understanding different localities and identities.
