Causes of Unemployment in Pakistan

Paragraph #1

Topic Sentence

One of the main causes of unemployment in Pakistan is the negative stigmatization of manual labour jobs and gender stereotypes about certain professions, which influences career choices.

Explanatory Sentence

The impression that manual labour is dirty, low-paying and unskilled and that some occupations are more suited to men than to women are all factors in the raising unemployment rate.

Supporting Sentence

Society still maintains a colonial mentality, as seen by their preference for being unemployed over shameful manual labour employment in Pakistan.

Evidence

While most Pakistanis dismiss

working as a careem or bykea driver as even a part-time job, over 80% of those who travel abroad work as deliverymen, masons, waiters, drivers, and other blue collar jobs.

Supporting Sentence (2)

Traditional gender roles have created a glass-ceiling for women that prevents them from pursuing certain professions, making it exclusive for one gender and utterly forbidden for other to pursue a career in that field.

Evidence / Example (2)

For instance, men are associated with manual work, automobiles, business and politics, while women are slotted into areas of health care, social services, the arts and personal care.

Hence, Pakistan faces unemployment as a result of negative stigmatization of manual labour and gender stereotypes associated with professions.

Paragraph #2

Topic Sentence.

There are numerous serious effects of unemployment in Pakistan because of the stigma attached to manual labour and gender-specific jobs.

Explanatory Sentence

People who are unable to obtain desired jobs migrate abroad in search of better living conditions, while others who are below poverty line turn to begging, which reflects failure of economic and social policy.

Supporting Sentence

Due to poor working conditions, many people choose begging over low-paying profession since it is more convenient.

Evidence/ Example.

According to Asian Human Rights Commission (AHRC), 2.5 to 11% of Pakistani population chooses to beg (Nehreen Anwar, Begging: 'A societal curse, September 2022).

Sentence
