His rebelliousness reached to its peak when he openly confronted Hitler. He challenged his plan and finally left his army.

2: Heinz Guderian's offensive tactics were characterized by innovation, mobility and aggressive nature. His tactics were offensive and effective as there were strategies to make deep thrusts into enemy

Q1:- Précis

Anatol Lieven, in his book "Pakistan: A Hard Country," discusses the resilience of Pakistani discipline and unity. He emphasizes on the potential challenges of moral pressures that gradually weaken the unity. He says that a rupture in Pakistani military discipline could only arise if the soldiers were conflicting with their loyal commanders. Such a scenario might be seen if the US invaded Pakistan and the army command failed to resist.

The perception of subservience to Washington has already caused enough morale issues in the military. Lieven highlights that the regional identity has gained political significance evidently from 2008 elections. However,

Pakistan identity is complex due to comprising multiple overlapping layers. A Lahore executive Ali Hassan tells him that people of Pakistan cannot come together. Even within a smaller communities there are fragmentations and divisions. Pakistanis even do not follow same kind of Islam. An Islamic revolution can't unite them. Pakistani's unity is constrained by the inability to rally behind an ideology.
