Explain the statement in context of theory and practice with special reference to Pakistan.

Introduction:

The theoretical framework advocates for subsidiarity, accountability and community participation. In practice, local self government involves the election of representatives, decentralization of decision making authority, resource allocation, community engagement and a commitment to accountability and transparency.

Local ^{self} government in theoretical framework:

Theory of local self government revolves around the principle of decentralization, emphasizing the delegation of authority and decision making power to local communities. The key components of theory include:

1- Subsidiarity The principle suggests that decisions should be made at lowest level of government capable of addressing a particular issue effectively. In other words, higher level of government should only intervene when necessary, allowing local entities to handle matters within their jurisdiction.

2) Community Empowerment

Theory emphasizes empowering communities to participate actively in decision making processes. It premeates idea that individuals

3) Accountability in local self government

Local self government in context of Pakistan

① Devolution of power:

Pakistan has experienced phases of devolution of power, notably through local government Acts of various provinces. For instance, the 18th amendments to constitutionⁱⁿ 2010 aimed to devolve certain powers to provinces, empowering them to establish local governments.

② Elected Local Representatives

Local bodies in Pakistan such as union councils or municipal committees have elected representatives. These representatives are responsible for addressing local issues, ^{which} manages resources and make decisions that impact communities.

3) Resource allocation:

Local governments in Pakistan are tasked with managing and allocating resources at grassroot level. However, there have been instances where insufficient financial autonomy and dependence on higher levels of government have limited their ability to address local needs adequately.

Critical Analysis of local self government in Pakistan:

1) Political Interference:

2) Bureaucratic hurdles
