He plotted an assassination attempt on Hitler but failed by placing a bomb next to him in his East Prussian headquarters, the Wolf's Lair. However, he failed in his endeavour as the bomb could not inflict any harm on Hitler. Subsequently, in the aftermath of a failed coup he was shot dead on the orders of his superior and accomplice General Fromm, who hoped to save his own life.
