Conforming to social norms holds a great deal ^{of importance} in individual and societal life. Conforming to social norms promotes individualism and ~~promotes~~ improves relations with friends and family. It provides one with a support system and security and hence eases life. For peace and harmony to prevail in a society, individuals are required to adhere to ~~norms~~ the standard norms. This will ~~infuse~~ ^{infuse} in them a sense of patriotism, uniting the people in the process. Hence, conforming to societal norms also improves the educational development and political sense of an individual and society. Promoting culture attracts foreigners to the arts and crafts of a society, hence, one must stick to it. Drifting away from social norms, on the other hand, promotes antisocial and rebellious behaviour which consequently impacts relations negatively and leads to criminal behaviour. As much as conforming to societal norms is ~~to~~ crucial, one must identify the four traits of a society and not conform to it. The four traits must be eradicated.

A community is based on many societal norms which serves as a standard for human behaviour and are a basis on which the society is set up.

As the social needs of man are fulfilled by adhering to societal norms, he develops himself as an individual. By interacting with other human beings, a person learns about life, ethics, morals, skills and good behaviour. If a person were to drift away from the norms, he would not be able to learn about the broad spectrum of human emotions and how to handle them. By sticking to societal norms one can adopt the good traits of the society. For instance, Japanese are known for their kindness, hence, sticking to the societal norms of Japan will instill kindness in a person. Similarly, on a broader spectrum, Asians are known for their intellect. So by conforming to the typical Asian societal norms, one can develop the faculty of intellect. Hence, one must conform to societal norms for individual development.

Conformity to societal norms is not only beneficial to individual life but it is also significant in the society and social lives of people. If individuals hold on to the social norms, it will promote peace and harmony. Following common societal norms will create lesser chances of conflict in the community. One such example is the movement for ~~to~~ independence in the subcontinent. Indian Muslims joined hands because of their common social and religious norms and put the "two nation theory" into action. As a result, they gained independence and Pakistan ~~was~~ came into being in 1947. (Another example is that of china. After gaining independence, Chinese people by sticking to their norms and relying on each other instead of foreign aids, built up their nation until they became a superpower. Therefore, to achieve success, ~~the~~ people of a nation should conform to its social norms.

Conforming to societal norms can enhance one's life, meanwhile going against them can create disturbance and havoc in an individual's personal life as well as in the society. Going against social norms affects the personal and social life of a person. The "odd one out" in the family or social set up usually has the most difficult time. For instance Socrates, a famous Greek philosopher, was sentenced to death by drinking poison, even though his efforts in the field of political science were exceptional. Therefore, to have a peaceful and blissful life, one should stick to societal norms.

The rebellious behaviour of going against societal norms also affects one's professional life. If career of a person is likely to get negatively affected because of one's rebellious behaviour. Different organizations around the world are discouraged to employ individuals who go against the social norms. For instance, law firms are less likely to employ a lawyer. For instance, many organizations and institutions, ~~for ex~~ such as some law firms or Korean music industries, prohibit tattoos. They are. Similarly, educational institutions are less likely to employ a cross dresser as a teacher. Therefore, one's rebellious nature can affect his or her professional life.
