Don't leave the choice on examiner to choose your point for you

This is an effect not a cause

4. ~~Now~~ ^{Yes} environment is going to listen to all promise. (Anti-thesis)

Either attempt at expository or argumentative. Do not mix Both structures.

- a) Promise made in COP-27
- b) ~~Ten billion tree tsunami programme fulfilled by Government~~
- c) ~~Government initiatives to reduce plastics~~
- d) ~~Use of Biodegradable material~~
- e) ~~Actions taken by Environmental Protection Agency (Sepa)~~
- f) ~~Working on less carbon emissions~~

Discuss not just fulfilled pledges but the ones where the environmental response has been positive.

5. Provide more damage to environment rather than protecting it (Synthesis)

Does not align with either the Thesis or the antithesis.

- a) Broke promises made in Paris Agreement - 2015
- b) Growing due to growing population & meager forest area covered by forests (2021-22 survey)
- c) Deforestation for development projects
- d) Violation of protection of Coastal Environment law
- e) Failure to Fail to stop carbon trading
