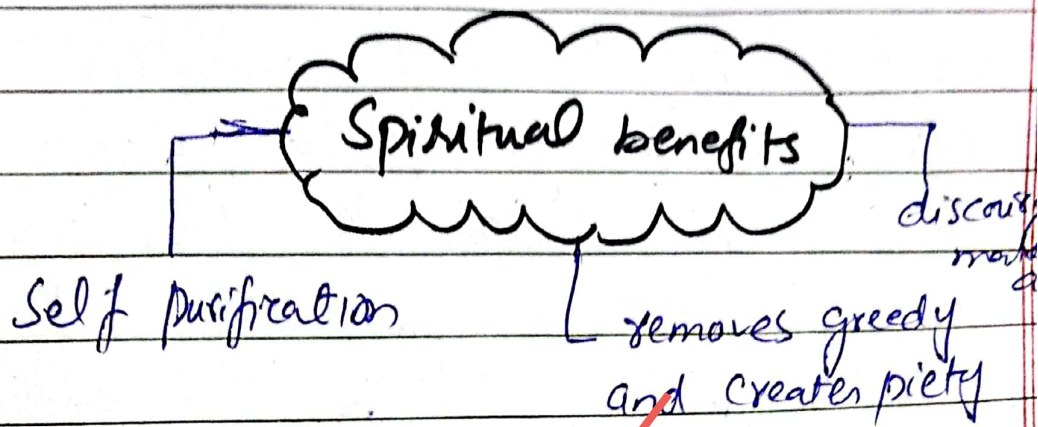
"Allah has made zakat obligatory on you because the remaining wealth may become pure for you."

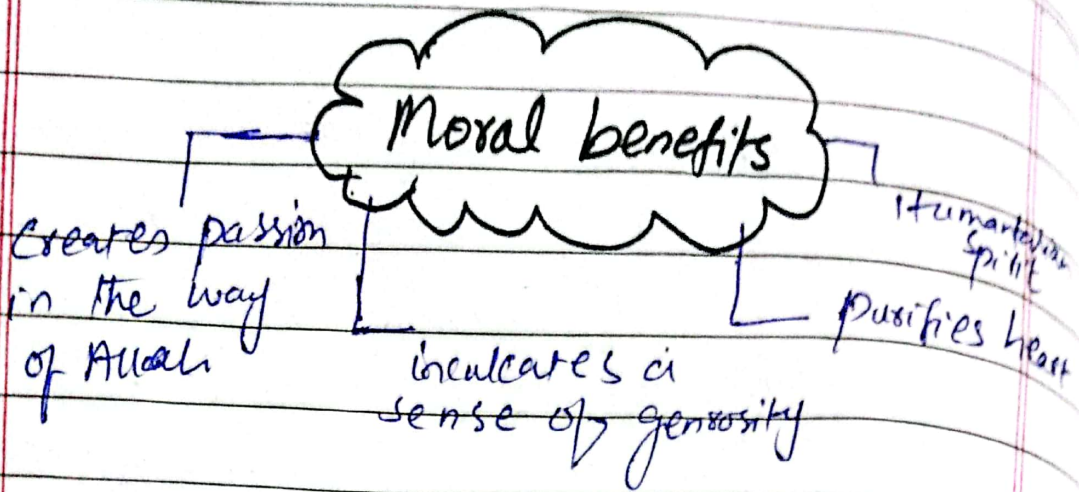
As Holy prophet (PBUH) says

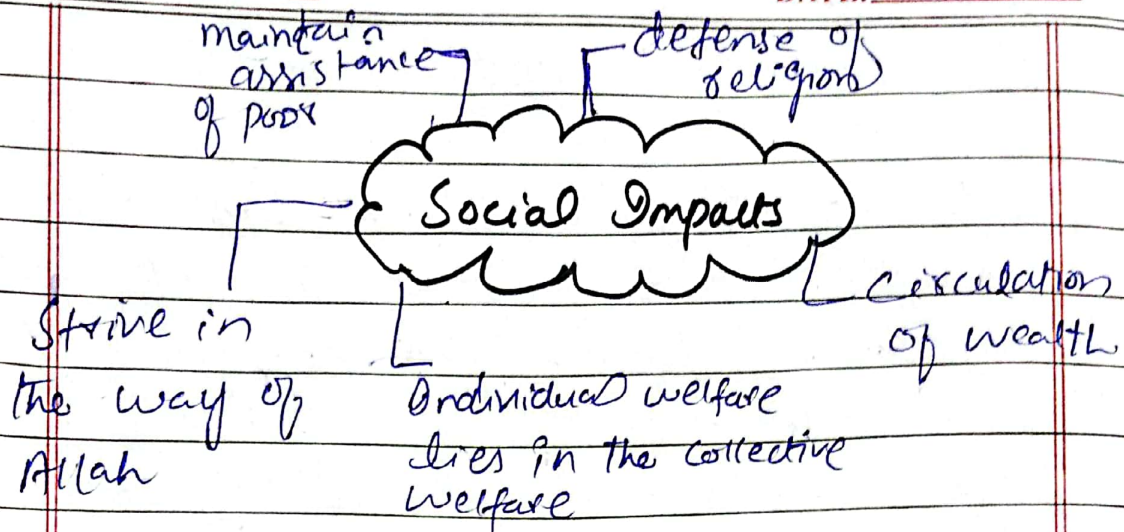
ii) Inculcate passion in the way of Allah

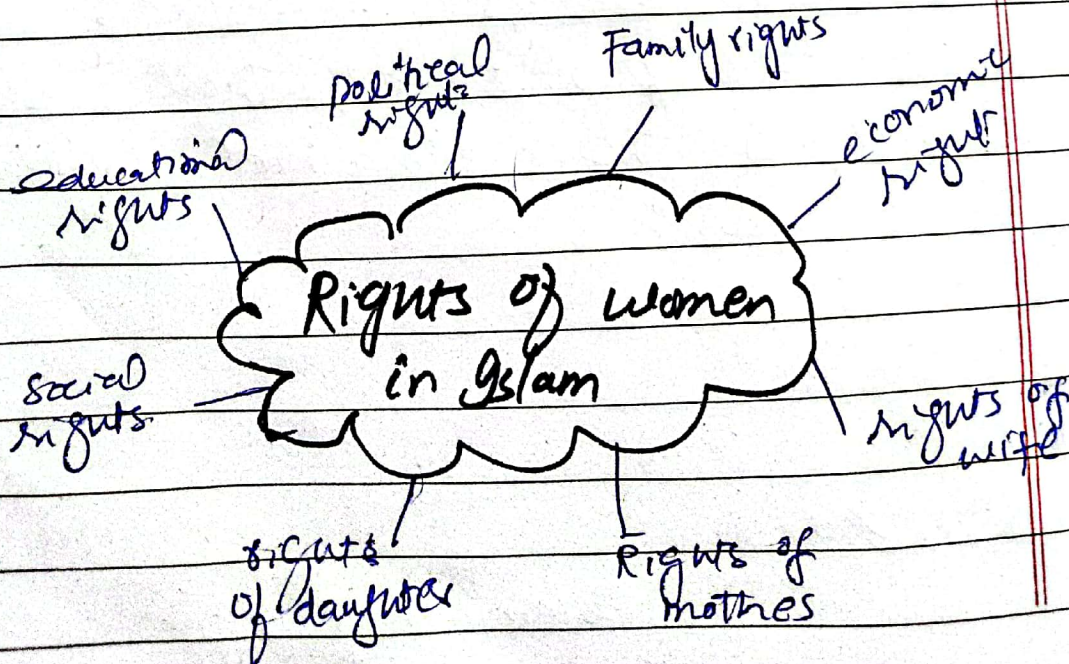
