* Introduction

* Contextual meaning

Philosophy of zakat

It means that mother has more rights on a person than his/her father.

* Women as a wife:-

Islam has teach to treat the wives with love and respect. It is the saying of Hadith that if your wife is seen with another man, or is bad character, you are not supposed to beat her or hurt her physically. you just have to separate your bed from her, if she still do not understand then

you must leave her in form of separation, but you have no right to abuse her or kill her or hurt her. Islam has directed men to treat their wives with love, care and respect. Also it is obligation of men to take care of her necessities.

* Women as a daughter:.

Our holy prophet (PBUH) was father of daughters. He brought them up with all love and care. "Do not kill them." (Al-Quran). Islam said that if you have daughter, you will be rewarded in day of judgement.

"If you brought up three daughters, with love and take responsibility of all her necessities. Gannah will become Wajib on you." (Al-hadith).

* Khutba Hujjat ul Wida:.

At the final Khutba of holy prophet (PBUH) he addressed the people on human rights

Political rights
Economic rights
Family rights

and more ^{specially} on the rights of women. He told the ummah about the importance of women rights in Islam and in Quran.

- "Muslim women are first and foremost muslims, the religious equal of men". (Al-Quran)
