2. Geo-strategic importance of Indian Ocean:




Figure: 0.1 importance of IO




Figure: 0.2 map of IO / the trade routes

3. Globalization impacted the concept of security in the 21st century:




Figure 0.3 impacts of globalization on the concept of security.
