



### Question:


Q1: What is the main idea of Enzo Ferrari's quote, and how does Yusuf Dikec's story challenge it?


Q3: Describe two factors that contribute to Dikec's second or third-place finishes being more celebrated than some first-place wins.

### Extraordinary Skill and Determination:




Q:4 How does the media influence public perception of Dikec's achievements?
