Genden-According to WHO, Gender refers to the characteristics of women, men, girls and boys that are socially constructed this includes norms, behaviors and voles associated with being a women, man, girl or boy as well as relationships with each other. Gender based violence (GBV):-Gender based violence (GBV) is violence directed against a person because of that person's gender or violence that affects persons of a particular gender dispropertionales 91 can include violence against women, domestic violence against the same domestic unit. Although women and girls are the



main victims of gender based harm to families and communities. Theories of Gender-Based Violence: Pakriarchal theorponot priotize this theory Patriarchal theory explains that gendou based violence is a result of patriarchal societies where men hold power and control over women. It argues that such violence is a way to maintain male dominance. In many societies, including parts of Pakistan, violence against women can be linked to traditional views that men should control women's behaviour and choices. 2- Social learning theory 1-Social learning theory posits that people learn behaviour through observing others of individuals witness violence or ere exposed to violence behaviour in their environment, they may come to see it as normal or acceptable.

For example, if children grow up in households where domestic violence is prevalent, they might leaven to accept they this behaviour in their own relationship. 3- Structural Aheory:This theory focuses on how societal structures and institutions contributes to GBV.
