Q2: Explain the doctrine of Tauheed in Islam.

Describe its importance in human life.

How it affected the life of a faithful?

Ans: The doctrine of tauheed (also spelled) tauheed

is the fundamental concept in Islam, emphasizing the oneness and uniqueness of Allah (God). It is the central theme of the Quran and the core of Islamic faith.

Tauheed means:

1- Unity of existence -

Allah is the sole creator, sustainer, and destroyer of the universe.

2- Unity of lordship -

Allah is the only lord, and all worship should be directed towards Him alone.

3- Unity of names and Attributes -

Allah's names and attributes are unique and cannot be shared with anyone or anything.

Important in human life:

1- Guides human behavior -

Tawheed provides a moral framework guiding individuals to live a righteous life, free from polytheism and sin.

2- Fosters humility and gratitude - recognizing Allah's oneness and power cultivates humility and gratitude leading to a sense of accountability and responsibility.

3- Promotes unity and equality - Tawheed emphasizes the equality of all humans before Allah, transcending racial, social, and economic differences.

Effects of faithful's life -

1- Devotion and worship - A faithful focuses on worshipping Allah alone, following his commands and seeking his guidance.

2- Moral Character - Tawheed inspires individuals to develop good morals, such as honesty, compassion, and justice.

3- Inner Peace and Contentment - Tawheed brings a sense of peace and contentment, as individuals trust in Allah's wisdom and providence.

Ijma :-

Ijma is the consensus of the muslim community, particularly the scholars, on a specific issue or interpretation of Islamic law. It is a secondary source of Shariah, after the Quran and Sunnah.

Principles of Ijma:

- Unanimity Ijma requires the agreement of all qualified scholars.
- Scope Ijma applies to issues not explicitly addressed in the Quran and Sunnah.
- Authority Ijma is binding on the muslim community.

Importance in Secondary Sources of Shariah :-

Complementing the Quran and Sunnah: Ijma fills gaps in Islamic law, providing guidance on new issues.

Ensuring Consistency in Islamic Jurisprudence
 Authority and legitimacy: Ijma provides a basis for Islamic rulings, ensuring they align with the collective understanding of the muslim community.
