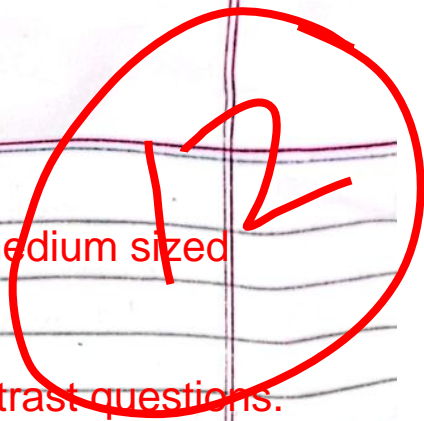

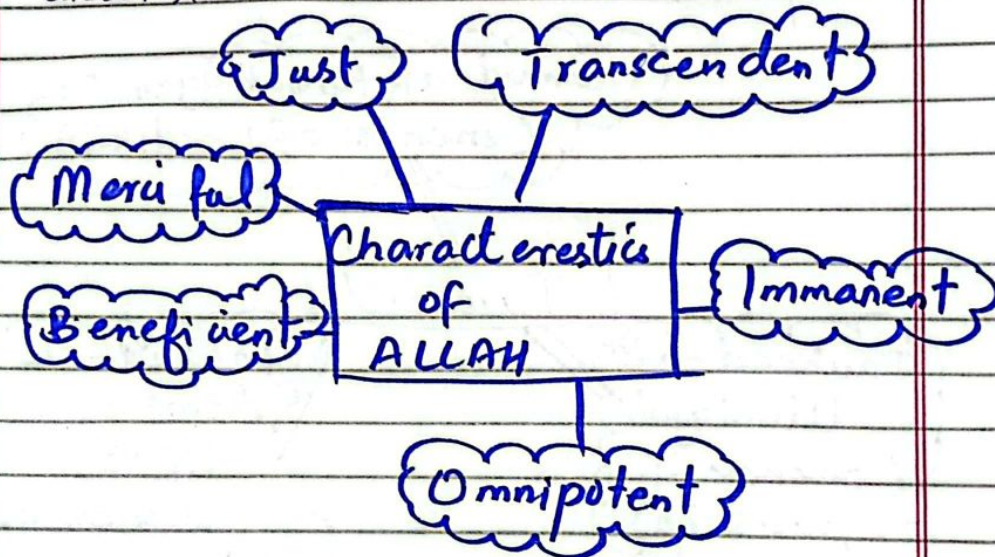

of being a Muslim is to carry out Allah's will, to submit or surrender themselves to him. Muslims use the word Tawhid to describe the idea that they believe in one God. This is the most fundamental idea of Islam accepted by all Muslims.

• Belief in characteristics of Allah

They believe Allah has certain characteristics which help them to understand what he is like:



• Cornerstone of Islamic faith

The main message of Islam is monotheism. Belief in monotheism is the cornerstone of the Islamic faith. Muslims believe that all the prophets sent by God to humanity shared the same central message.

• Foundations of Muslim faith

and that was the message of monotheism. Monotheism is the term used to refer to the belief in the existence of only one God. Muslims believe that there is only one God who created the universe and everything within it. This one God created the heavens, the Earth, the stars, the mountains, the oceans, humans, animals, plants and everything else in existence. If we want to thank someone for the blessing we have, it should be this only God. Only, this God is able to truly help or harm you.

- **Love of ALLAH precedes:**

Of course we are asked to love our family, friends and all humans. However, our love for God should be at a higher level, since it's God who created our family, friends and everyone else around us. We should only fear God and not fear anyone or anything else more than we fear God. However, our fear of God should be a high level since God not only controls our life in this world, but he will judge us in the after life.

- **Foundations of Muslim faith:**

Belief in Allah is the foundation for

which a Muslim's faith is built upon. It is to believe that Allah is the only creator, sustainer, king, and planner of everything in existence.

"O men! call to mind the grace of Allah unto you! Is there a creator, other than Allah, to give you sustenance from heaven or earth? There is no god but He; how then are ye deluded away from the truth?
(Surah Fatihah: Verse: 3)

"Take not with Allah another object of worship; or thou (O man!) wilt sit in the disgrace and destitution.
(Surah Al-Isra: Verse: 22)

Central Aspect of Teachings of Quran and Sunnah:

A Muslim believes that Allah possesses Names and Attributes that only belong to him. There is nothing in existence that is similar to him. There is nothing mythical about the Divine. Being in Islam, Allah describes Himself right in the opening Surah of the Quran (Al-Fatihah):

"Praise and glory belong only to Allah, the sustainer of all the worlds, the most beneficent and

and the most beneficent and merciful,
the Lord of the Day of judgement.
It is thee that we worship and
of thee we seek help and succor...

The following verses regarding the Divine
'throne' (kursi) will elucidate the point:

"His throne extends over the
heavens and the earth and the
up-keep of either (i.e. heavens or
the earth) is not a burden unto
him..." (Quran 2:255)

- **Recognition of his Omnipotence
without Question**

The Quran, however, says that there
is nothing mysterious about God's
laws once we recognize His omnipotence
without question. The divine revelation
throws light on the subject:

"To him belong the keys of the
heavens and the earth; He
enlarges and restricts the
sustenance to whom He wills;
for He knows full well all
things." (Surah Ash-Shura:
Verse 12)

- **Believe in His Justice**

The Quran further elaborates that
the mere fact that someone is provided

sustenance and material comfort more bounteously than others should not be taken as God's special favor on that person:

“Allah enlarges or grants by strict measure the sustenance to whomsoever He pleases. The worldly folk rejoice in the life of this world; but the life of this world is of little comfort in the hereafter”

(Ar-Rad: Verse 26)

Importance in Human Life

• Foundation of Belief:
