(iii) Eat crow:

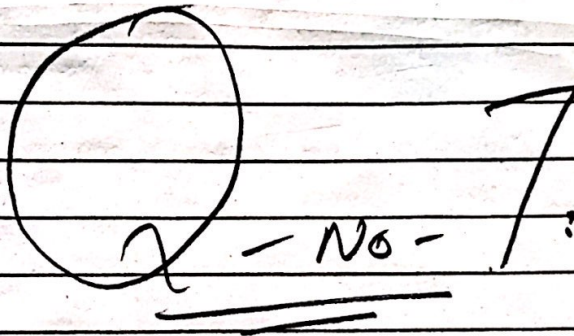
Eating the stale food felt like eating crows to Ali.
