Touheed

1: Introduction

Touheed is the fundamental Islamic belief in the absolute oneness and uniqueness of Allah. This concept forms the foundation of Islam, emphasizing that Allah Alone is the Creator, Sustainer and Sovereign of the entire universe. The term Touheed is derived from the Arabic word *wahhada*, which means to make something one or to unify. For a muslim Touheed is not only an intellectual acknowledgment but a belief that governs all aspects of life, influencing both internal spirituality and outward actions. Touheed, therefore is not just a concept but a guiding principle that defines a believer's purpose, actions and connection to the Creator. The

Quran describes the uniqueness of Allah in Surah Al-Ikhlas: "Say He is Allah, [who is] One, the Eternal Refuge. He neither begets nor is born, nor is there to Him any equivalent". (112 : 1-4)

2. Islamic concept of Tauheed

Tauheed is our first part of Kalimah. According to the teaching of Prophet (PBUH), Tauheed is the gateway of Islam. Tauheed is the core pillar of Islam. It gives the concept only Allah is worthy of worship. It is the complete code of life.

3. Types of Tauheed

There are three types of tauheed.

I. Tauheed al-Rububiyyah:

It is the belief that Allah alone is the Lord of all existence. He is the sole Creator, Sustainer and administrator of the universe, with

no partner or associates. This form of tawheed acknowledges that Allah controls all that exists from the movements of galaxies to the smallest particles. The Quran states; "Praise be to Allah, Lord of all the worlds" (Quran 1:2), affirming that Allah alone has authority over creation, management and the life and death of every being.

II. Tawheed al-Uluyyah:

It refers to the belief that Allah alone deserves all forms of worship. Muslim's belief that worship should be directed solely to Allah, and nothing else can be associated with Him in any act of devotion. This type of Tawheed is a rejection of all forms of shirk and an affirmation of Allah's exclusive right to be worshipped.

The Quran reinforces this by saying, "And your god is one God."

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There is no deity except Him, the Entirely Merciful, the Especially Merciful" (Quran 2: 163).

III. Tauheed al- Asma wa al-Sifat:

It emphasizes the belief in Allah's unique and perfect names and attributes, as revealed in the Quran and Sunnah. This aspect of tauheed means affirming as revealed Allah's attributes without comparing them to those of His creation.

Allah's names are not shared or comparable to those of his creatures and his attributes are understood without comparing into ~~sep~~ speculative comparisons. The Quran states:

"There is nothing like unto Him, and He is the Hearing, the Seeing" (42:11).

4- Impacts of Tauheed on Individual Life:

I. Spiritual Purity and Focus:

Believing in tauheed leads to spiritual by directing worship and

devotion solely to Allah. By acknowledging Allah's oneness, Muslims focus their spiritual practices on gaining His pleasure and avoiding any actions that might involve worshipping others.

This promotes sincerity in worship as one's actions are carried out solely for Allah's sake. The Quran emphasizes this by saying: "Say Indeed, my prayer, my rites of sacrifice, my living and my dying are for Allah, Lord of the worlds (6: 162). This focus helps muslims stay away from material distractions and gives them a clear purpose in life.

II. Moral and Ethical Discipline:

Tauheed also reinforces ethical behavior, as believers understand that they are accountable to Allah for their actions. A strong belief in tauheed shapes an individual's character by fostering qualities such

as humility, honesty and compassion. Knowing that Allah is aware of every action and intention keeps a believer morally disciplined and encourages them to act in ways that are pleasing to Allah. The Quran reminds believers, Indeed, Allah is with those who fear Him and those who are doers of good" (16:128), promoting a sense of ethical responsibility that impacts both personal and social conduct.

III. Inner Peace and Mental

strength:

Tauheed provides mental and emotional resilience by teaching that Allah is in control of all circumstances. Believers learn to trust Allah's wisdom and power which brings them inner peace and helps them face life's challenges without fear or anxiety. This belief also reduces dependence on worldly

matters, as a person places their full reliance on Allah. The Quran encourages this reliance stating, "And whoever relies upon Allah - then He is sufficient for Him" (65:3). Through Tawheed individuals develop a deep sense of calm, contentment and strength, knowing they are under Allah's care.

5. Impacts of Tawheed on Society

I. Social Justice and Unity:

Tawheed fosters a sense of equality and justice within society, as it teaches that all people are equal before Allah.

Recognizing Allah as the only supreme authority discourages discrimination based on race, status or wealth.

Promoting unity and brotherhood.

By promoting tawheed, societies are encouraged to build communities based on justice, equality and mutual respect.

II. Promotion of compassion and cooperation:

The belief in tauheed nurtures a compassionate society by encouraging mutual respect and empathy among individuals. Knowing that everyone is created by Allah fosters love and cooperation for the common good. In a society grounded in tauheed, people are motivated to help one another, uphold each other's rights and work collectively for the welfare of the community. "And cooperate in righteousness and piety, but do not cooperate in sin and aggression" (5:2).

III. Deterrence of corruption and injustice:

Tauheed serves as a moral deterrent against corruption and injustice. Since individuals are aware of Allah's omnipresence and ultimate

judgement, they are more likely to avoid unethical actions that could harm society. The fear of accountability in the Hereafter encourages honesty, transparency and fairness in societal dealings from business to governance. Touheed creates a society that strives to uphold justice and resist oppression.

6. Conclusion

Touheed is not just a theological concept but a transformative belief that profoundly influences both personal character and social values. The oneness of Allah shapes a Muslim's spirituality, ethical conduct, and social interactions ultimately leading to a peaceful and harmonious society. By adhering to touheed, Muslims are guided to live lives of justice, compassion, and devotion, fulfilling their role as servants of Allah. Through,

Tauheed, both individuals and societies are directed towards a path that aligns with Allah's divine wisdom and guidance.
