With the evolution of gender studies, another debate started:

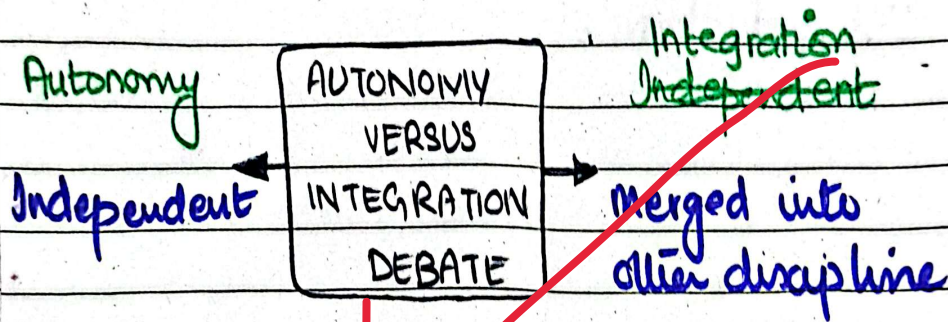

The Suppression of women has a very long history and traces back when matriarchal society had been brought to an end. Since then men had dominated women in every walk of life and had thus taken advantage of it.

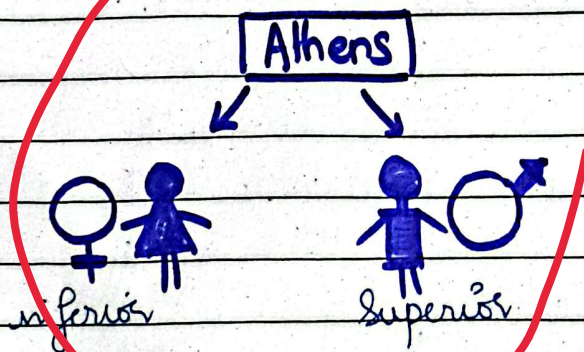

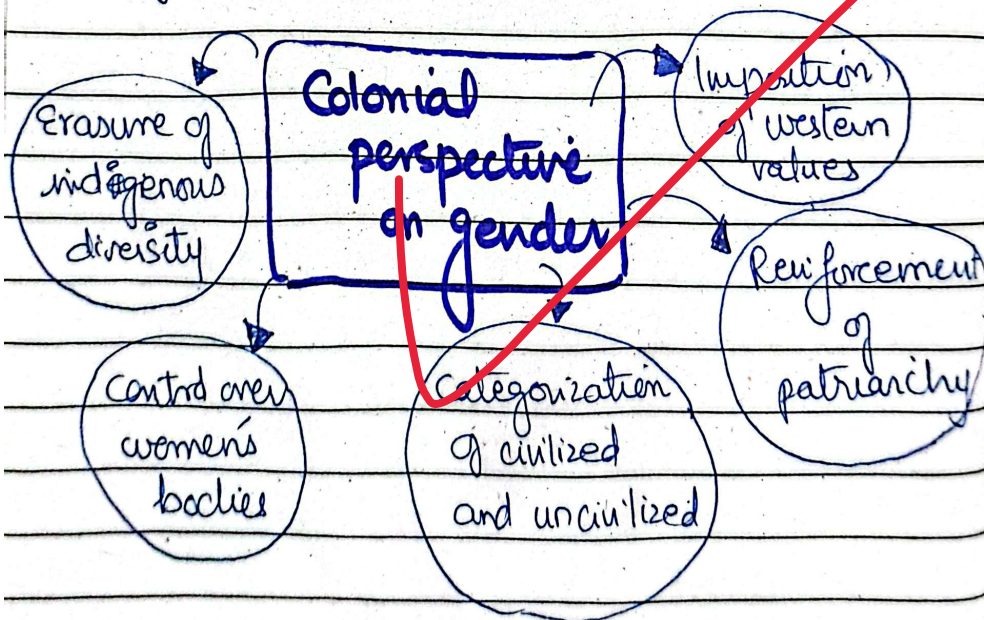
