


Instructions

1. Give numbering to headings
2. Do not write lengthy paragraphs. Write medium sized paragraphs with headings.
3. Do not use table for comparison and contrast questions.
4. Draw figures/diagram/flowchart where needed.
5. Start new question from fresh page.
6. Give around 15 headings for 20 marks question.
7. Every question should have introduction and conclusion paragraphs.
8. Add Quran/Hadees references wherever possible.
9. Narrate incidents from the life of Holy Prophet (SAWW) and Khulafa-e-Rashideen.
10. Add one quotation of famous religious scholar in each question.
11. Change colour scheme for references to give them more visibility.
12. Manage time
13. Wide page borders are discouraged. Should be reasonable.
14. Avoid writing wrong references.
15. Give more weightage to expressly asked part/s of the question.
16. Avoid writing wrong Quran/Hadith references. It puts extremely negative impression.

II Tawhid; Bedrock of Islam:

Tawhid is the basic and most fundamental concept in Islam. It is to profess and believe in oneness of Allah. It can be categorised into three types.



II.a. Oneness in person:

Tawhid, oneness in person, is to believe that there is only one God. He is alone worthy of worship. As mentioned in one of surahs of Quran:

قل هو الله احد الله المر لم يلد ولم يولد ولم يكن له كفوا احد
 "Say: He is Allah, the one and only, the eternal, absolute. He begets not, nor was he begotten. and there is none like unto him" — Surah Ikhlas

II.b. Oneness in attributes:

Oneness in attributes is to believe that Allah alone possess the qualities of perfect level. No one could share in attributes of Allah. In humans, one observes some of attributes, but they are obviously imperfect. In Quran, it is clearly mentioned that Allah is only worthy of all attributes

الله لا اله الا هو. له الاله اسماء الحسنی
 "God, there is no god but he, his are the beautiful names."


II. Oneness in actions:

Oneness in actions implies that Allah alone is capable of doing remarkable things. No one has potential or tendency to perform acts that God is capable of. He is creator and sustainer of world. He takes no help from anyone, in fact all derives their existence from him. A quranic verse beautifully demonstrates this.

لِلّٰهِ لَدٰى السَّمٰوٰتِ وَالْاَرْضِ وَمَا بَيْنَهُنَّ وَهُوَ عَلَىٰ كُلِّ شَيْءٍ قَدِيْرٌ

"To God belongs the sovereignty of the heavens and earth and everything in them, and he has power over all."

III. Impacts of Tawhid on individual life:



III.a. Provides man's life with divine purpose:

Firm belief in oneness of Allah begets strong conviction that lord is worthy of worship.

It ensures man realize that the lord who created him, deserves his devout worship. This gives man divine purpose.

Quran mentions this purpose unequivocally.

وما خلقنا الجن والانس الا ليعبدون
"and we have not created men and
jinn except that they should worship
me."

III.b. Inculcates self respect:

The fact that Allah has created and blessed man with such a divine purpose of life, inculcates self-respect in man. The very thought that Lord himself has created man and honoured him, builds a sense of pride in him. Quran mentions Allah honouring the whole of humanity as follows.

والله اكرمنا بنبي آدم... وفضلنا على كثير ممن خلقنا تفضيلا
"we have honoured the children of Adam...
and greatly favoured them over many of
those we created."

III.c. Instills humility in individual:

Realising the might of Al-mighty and having faith in him make individual humble. He arrives to conclusion that everything is Allah's and a person is naught in front of his all powerful Lord. Believing in Allah will ensure man fulfill his commandment to best of his abilities and God has forbid man from being arrogant or obstentacious.

"Allah says: 'pride is my cloak and greatness my robe, and whoever competes with me with regard to either of them, I shall throw him into hell fire.' — Ibn Majah


III.d. Provides man with peace and contentment:

faith and believe in Allah fills man's life with everlasting peace and contentment. True peace can only be achieved through belief in Allah. Allah himself says in quran that he provides peace to those who remembers his word.

الذي يذكر الله تطمئن القلوب

"Surely, it is in the remembrance of God that hearts find comfort."

IV Implications of Tauhid in collective life:



IV.a. Creates sense of brotherhood:

One belief creates sense of uniformity among people. People are united on basis

of one ideology. This concept is concept of ummah. All muslim no matter where they are based, are considered as one group. Quran also declares all muslims as brothers to one another.

انما المؤمنون اخوة
"Certainly all muslims are brothers."

IV.b. Equality among all humans:

Concept of tawheed brings sense equality to collective life of individuals. Knowing that God is superior and the one and all human beings are his servants, make humans realise that they are not superior to each other on basis of wealth, race or ethnicity. The Prophet made that very clear at sermon of Hajj.

"No arab is superior to ajam and no ajam is superior to arab. white has no superiority over black neither black over white. most reverend among you is the most pious." — Last sermon.

IV.c. Building just society:

Tawhid promotes observing Allah's commandments. One of the most significant command is bringing justice to society. Concept of justice is applicable in collective lives, when individual interact with each
