The last year and half has exposed the vulnerabilities of Axis of resistance and Iran:

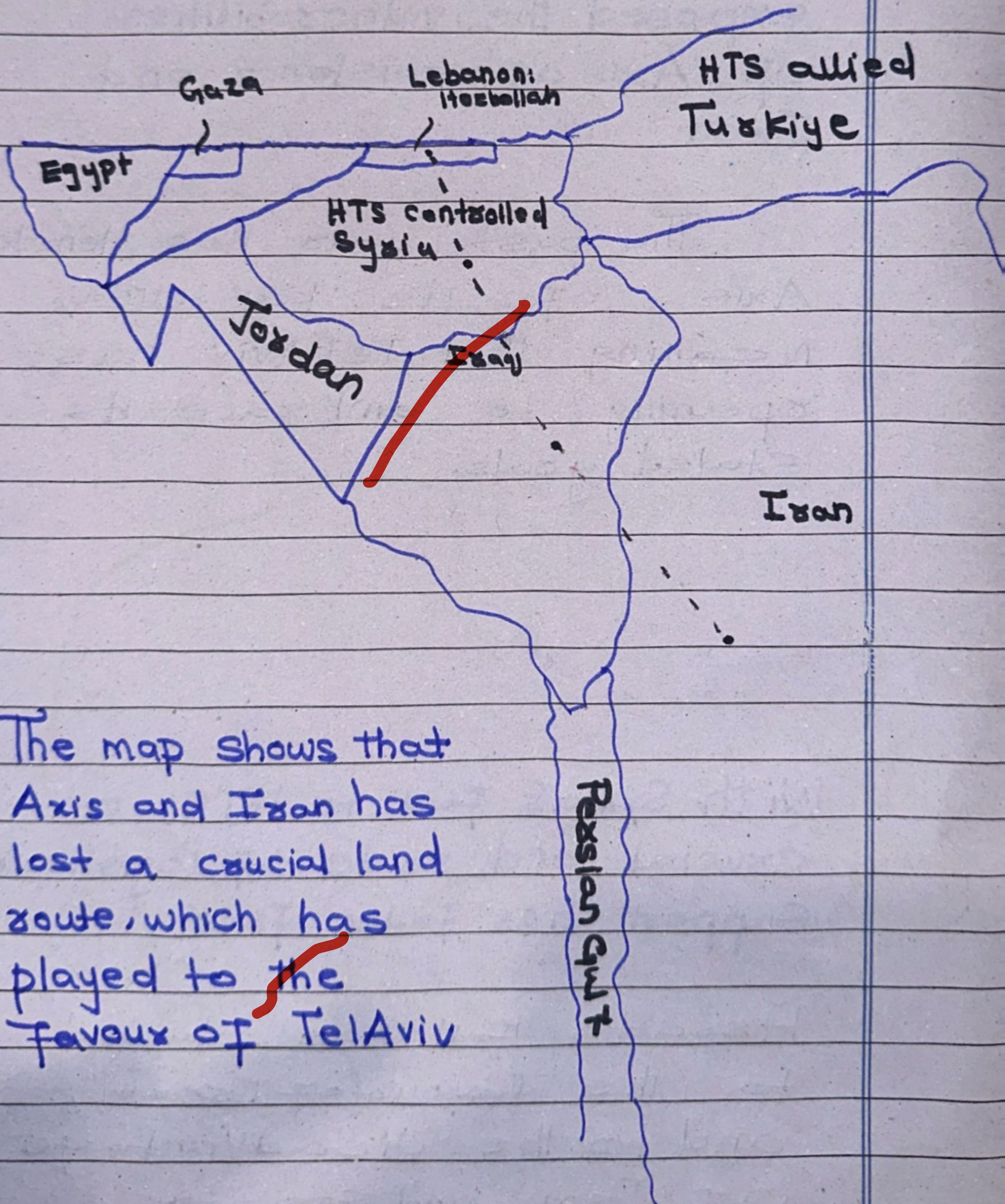
The past year has denuded Axis of its key allies, meaning that Tel Aviv has opening to embrace its stated goals.

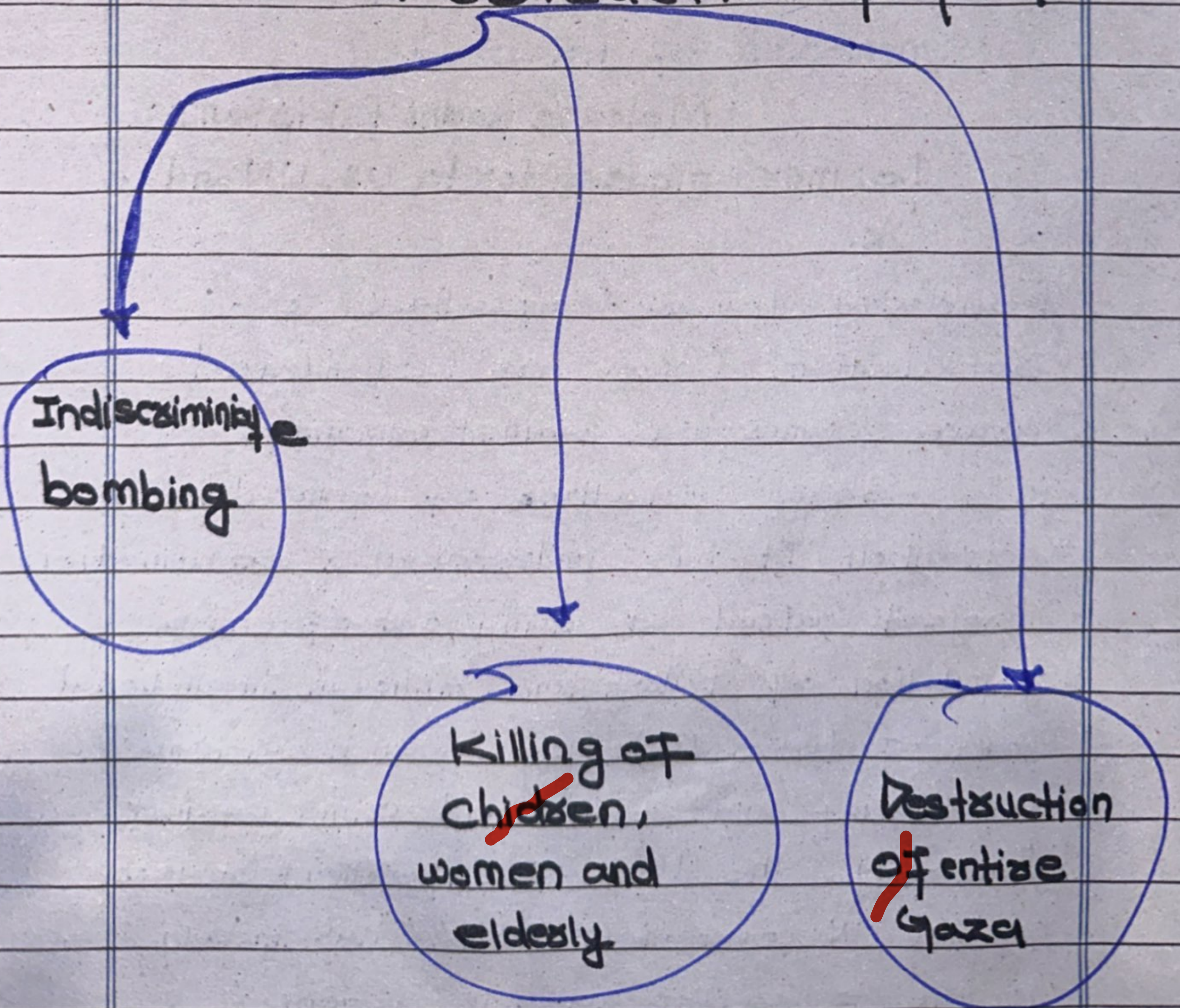
The US has long been its patron and
