Q2. Elucidate the doctrine of Tauheed (Unity of God) in Islam. Describe its importance in individual and collective life?

LITERAL MEANING OF TAWHEED:

The word Tawheed has been derived from the Arabic roots 'وحد' which literally means oneness and uniqueness.

Contextual meaning:

The term Tawheed means that (SAWW) is ^{one} in his being and attributes. He is the ^{only one who is} worthy of worship to be worshipped and obeyed.

Say, "He is Allah, (who is) one"

Origin of Concept of Tawheed:

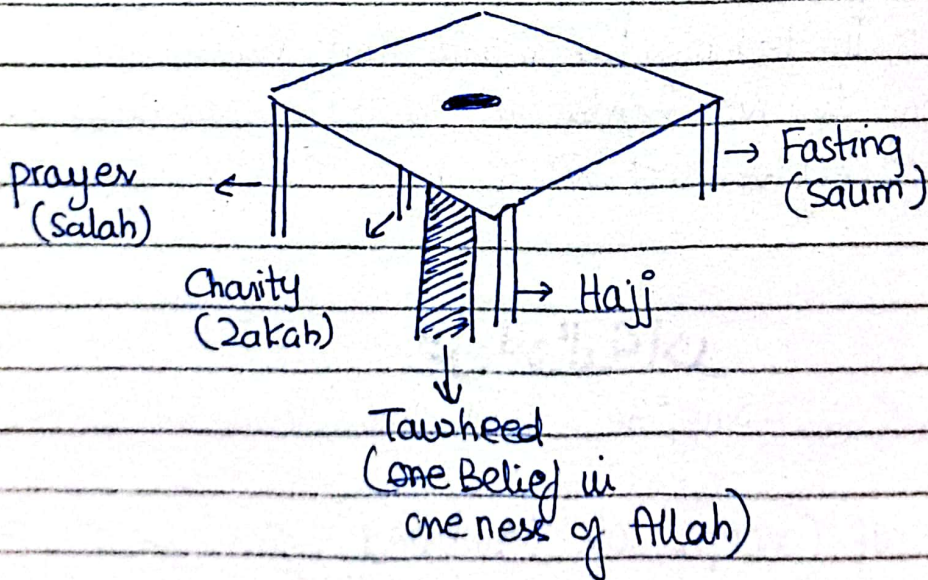
Tawheed is an Islamic concept that refers to oneness of Almighty Allah. The concept have been around since beginning of human life, and is laid the foundations of Muslim ethics.

Explanation of the Concept of Tawheed:

Tawheed is one of the basic and the first pillar of Islam, without which all the other four pillars would fall. A person's faith can only be strong if he firmly believes in Tawheed.

HADITH: Tawheed is the gateway of Islam.

To further understand the significance of Tawheed as the main pillar, a diagram is given below:

Significance of Tawheed:

The importance of Tawheed can be derived from multiple practices in Islam. For instance, in prayer we begin with Surahs that encircle Tawheed. To precisely explain Tawheed, its relying on the Almighty and believing in the fact that the entire universe runs and functions as per the orders of Al-mighty Allah.

ومن آياته الليل والنهار والشمس والقمر

(Surah Fussilat: 37)

And of his signs are the night and day and the sun and moon.

Thus, the single verse of the Quran explains the control of Allah Almighty over the entire universe.

Comprehending Tawheed:

As earlier said, Tawhid is the core pillar of Islam. One needs to understand the meaning of Tawhid in depth in order to fully comprehend it.

Tawheed revolves around the following points mentioned:

(1) Believing in the fact that Allah Almighty is the sustainer, provider, guardian, and so on.

(2) There is only one God worthy of worship and that is Allah Almighty.

(3) Not attributing the qualities of Allah Almighty to his creation.

a) Unity in Person:

Before the arrival of Islam, and even today many believe in polytheism. However, John Clover in his book "The Evidence of God in an Expanding Universe" informs the readers that if there were multiple Gods, the universal system would have been disturbed.

However, this idea has already been presented in Quran 1400 years ago in multiple Surahs. Such as in Surah Ikhlas the oneness of Allah Almighty have been clearly explicitly mentioned:

قل هو الله احد

Say: he is Allah, (who is) one

الله الصمد

Allah is eternal and absolute

لم يلد ولم يولد

None is born of him and nor was he born

ولم يكن له كفوا احد

Surah - Ikhlas And there is none like him.

(b) Attributes of Allah:

The attributes of Allah are such that they can be given or associated to his creation. The 99 names of Allah Almighty explicitly defines his sovereignty and oneness. As an example one of the name of Allah Almighty is mentioned below:

المالك

Al-Malik

'The eternal lord'

This name of Allah informs his creation, that only he is the ever-living. By the end of this world 'man and Jinn' or 'Jin and Ins' both are going to die. Even, the death of Angel is going to die. It is only Allah Al-mighty who was and will remain for ever. So, this quality of Allah can never be possessed by any of his creation.

Moreover, different Chapters of Al-Qur'an informs us about the message of Tawheed such as 'Ayat-ul-Kursi'.

The recitation of Ayatul Kursi protects humans. Moreover it is recited for blessings and mercy of Allah. This portrays that man himself is nothing and it is only Allah who decides his affairs. An Ayah portrays the power and oneness of Allah:

"حسبي الله"

Allah is sufficient for me

(C) Unity in Actions:

It is the belief that all worldly or any affair is controlled by Allah Almighty. Nothing is in the control of human beings. Such as in Surah Yaseen there is a clear explanation of Allah Almighty's power of owning all the affairs.

"كن فيكون"

Be and it is.

Importance in Individual and Collective Life:

Since Tawheed is the core and basic pillar of Islam, it shapes individuals personality and also impacts ones collective life:

a) Impact on Individuals life:

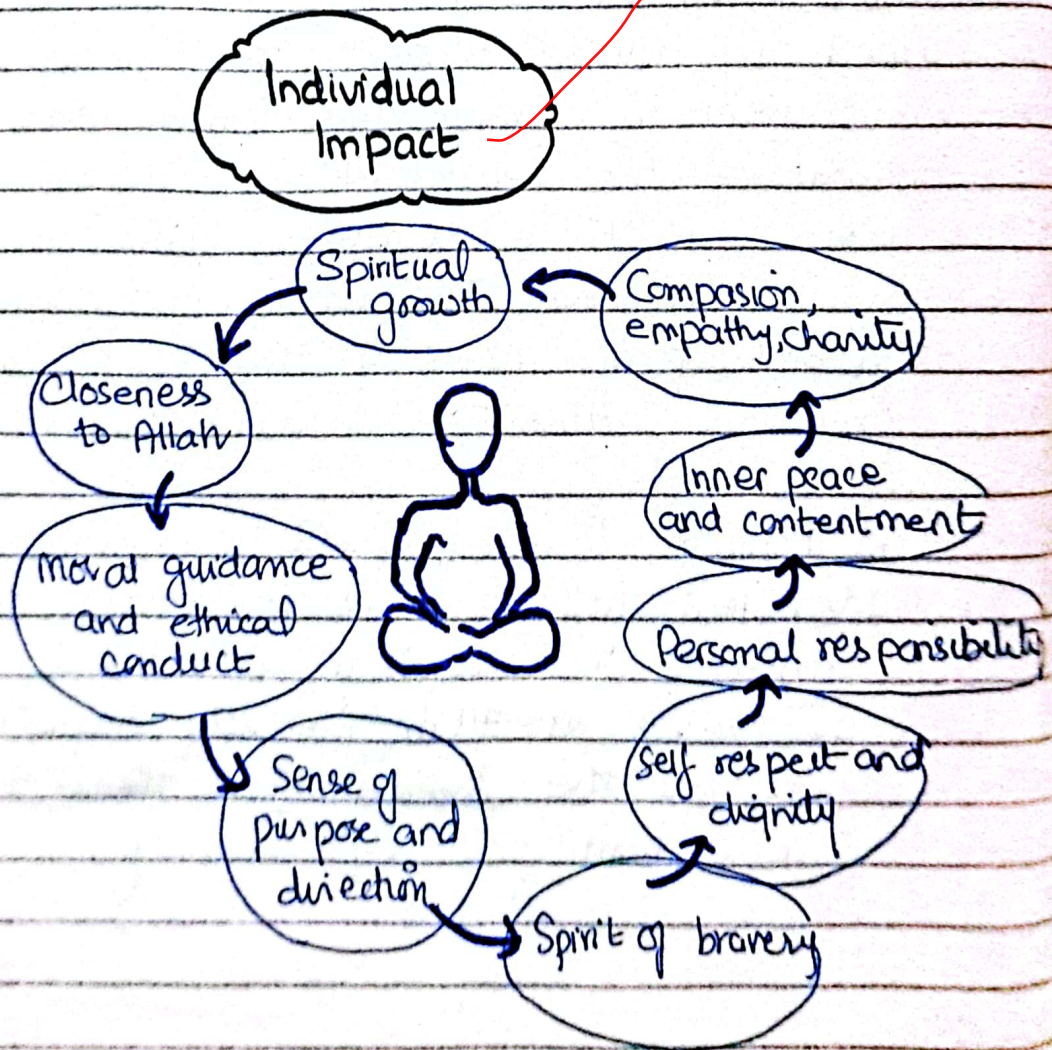
Tawheed plays a major role in humbling a person and shaping ones personality. As one knows that humbleness is liked by Allah Almighty. In addition to this one must also know that Satan was thrown out of the heaven because of his arrogance which is averse to Allah. Thus, one must know that Tawheed is a blessing and a gift from Almighty Allah and should be preserved within ones soul and personality.

Additionally, Tawheed instils in ones mind the idea that nothing lies in the hands of Allah creation. One adopts a personality in which ^{one} he relies on Allah Almighty completely. This gives one the freedom from fear and calms him during calamity.

Tawheed also instil in one's mind the fear of Allah which ~~be~~ inculcates within him the sense of right and wrong. Thus, this protects man from going towards things that are not dear to Allah - Almighty.

يا ايها الناس اتقوا ربكم
الذي خلقكم من نفس واحد

O men! Fear your Lord, who created you from a single being



(b) Impact on collective life.

Not only does Tawheed shapes and ameliorates individual life but it also makes better the social life and interactions. For instance, Tawheed promotes social welfare and guides one to help the poor and needy. This not only help in one's contentment, but also ameliorates and alleviates the society.

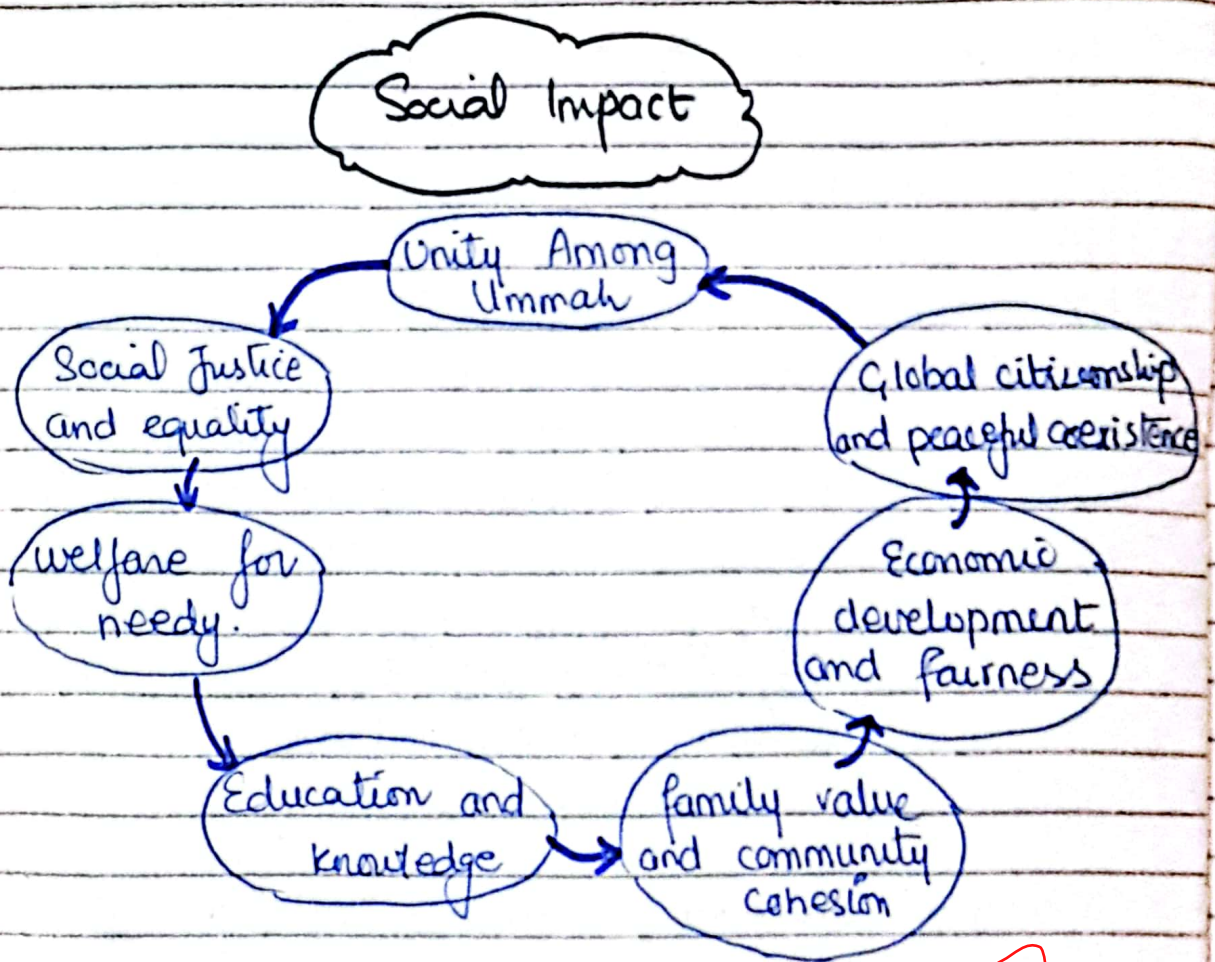
واقِيمُوا الصَّلَاةَ وَآتُوا زَكَاةً

And establish prayer and give Zakah.

Moreover, Tawheed inculcates within one the sense of brotherhood. Allah Almighty, regarding this, states in the Qur'an:

بَيْنَ إِخْوَتِكُمْ

The believers are "but brothers,
so make settlement between
your brothers.



Allama Muhammad Iqbal once said:

Denouement:

Q4. (Salah) Prayer is the basic pillar of worship in Islam. Analyze its social, moral, and spiritual impacts

LITERAL Meaning of Salah:

The word Salah or Prayer is derived from the root word 'Salat' or 'صَلَاة' which means 'to connect', 'link' or 'to communicate'. So, the word Salah literally means connection or link with Allāh through the act of ritual prayer.

Contextual meaning of Salah:

It is an Arabic word that means 'prayer' and refers to five daily prayers that Muslims perform.

Origin of Salah:

The Origin of Islamic prayer, salah, is attributed to the Prophet Muhammad and his followers, who were the first to use it in relation to Islamic beliefs. The instructions of Salah are clearly mentioned in the Holy Qurān.

واقموا الصلاة وآتوا الزكاة واركعوا

Surah Baqarah: verse 43

مع الراعيين

And establish prayer and give zakah and bow down with those who bow down.

Salah as the basic ~~prag~~ pillar of worship in Islam:

Salah is one of the important pillar of Islam. Without the which believe and person finds hard to tame his 'Nafs'. Qur'an contains abundance of integral verses that explain the importance of establishment of Salah. Moreover, the Hadith quotes its significance in an alarming way, informing the consequences of not praying. Prophet Muhammad P B U H in a Hadith said:

HADITH: The only difference between a believer and non-believer is that of prayer.

Thus, Salah must not be taken lightly and should be integrated in ones daily routine.

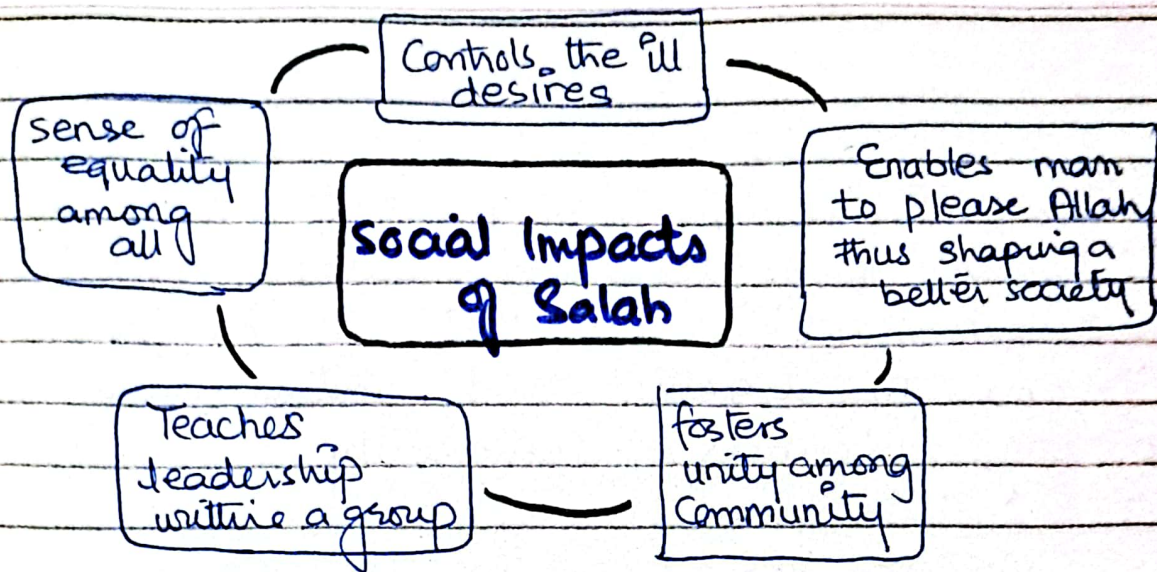
Impacts of the Salah:

Salah has many hidden blessings!

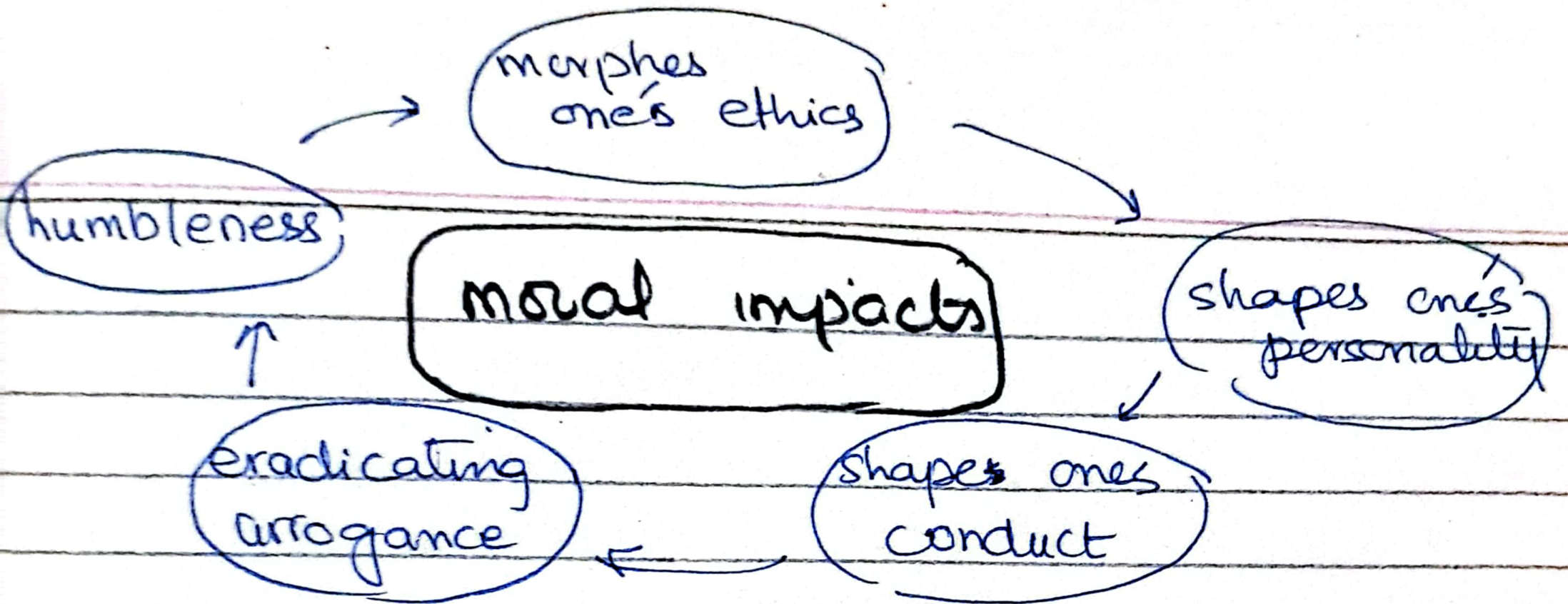
It is believed that people who pray two rakahs during the mid-night are granted noor. Thus, we can say that 'Salah' has many moral impact among which some of the are stated.

Truly, only through remembrance of Allah do hearts find peace.

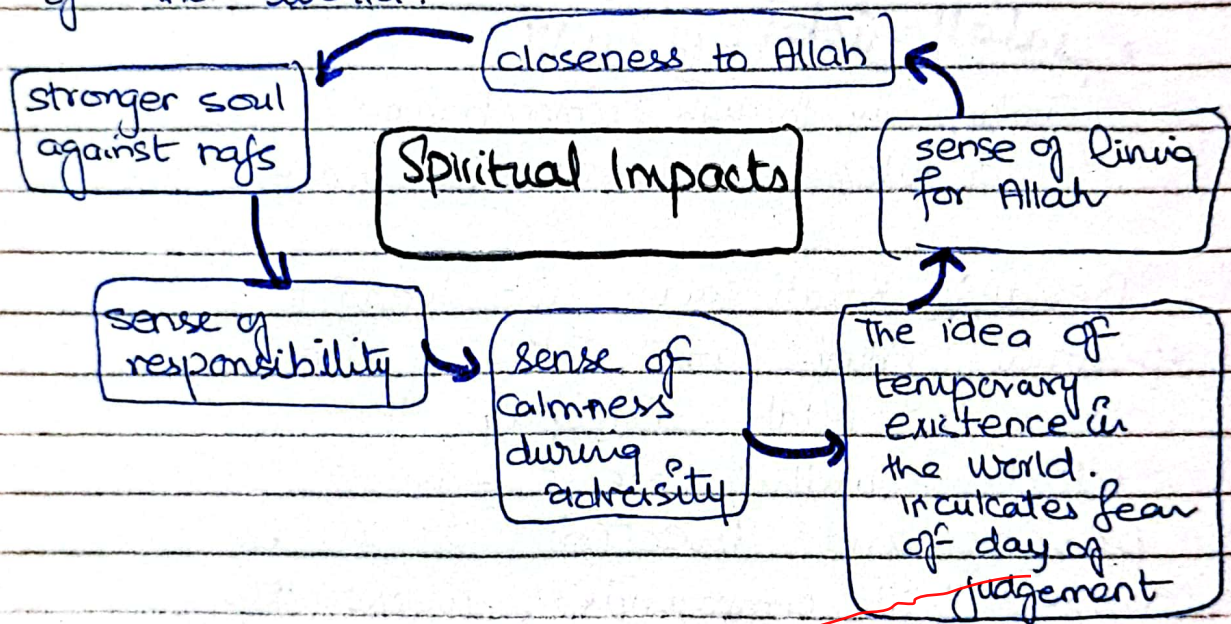
