For example, William Muir wrote a book on the life of Prophet[¶] "The life of Mohammed" in which he criticized the personality of Prophet[¶]. In his reply, Sir Syed wrote a book composed of essays that countered the views of William Muir. That book was called "Khutbat-e-Ahmadiya".

2) Sir Syed Helped Muslims in the Political Sphere

Sir Syed emphasized strongly to get education to compete with Hindus. However, he strictly prohibited his followers and muslims to take part in politics against Britishers.
