Emic ethnography explains the ideas and practices through the long of their own members, while etic etimography expains and analyses a culture according to principles or Laws drawn largely from Western Scientific traditions. Thus, Ethnography pormulates the description of a specific gulture. Example: Margaret Megd's field work in Satrioa : Margaret Mad's Work in Samoa in the 1920s is the classic example of of ethnography. She lived with the Samoan people for several months and gathered data through participatel observation, interviews and direct involvement.
