Key nations such as Saudi Arabia Iran, Turkey, and Pakistan, should engage in open dialogue and collaboration, uniting around a common objective through facilitation of Organization of Islamic counivies (OIC) which can coordinale efforts and issue unified siances on such issues. The Ummah should push for sanctions against Israeli goods and companies involved in settlementbuilding and human rights violation.
