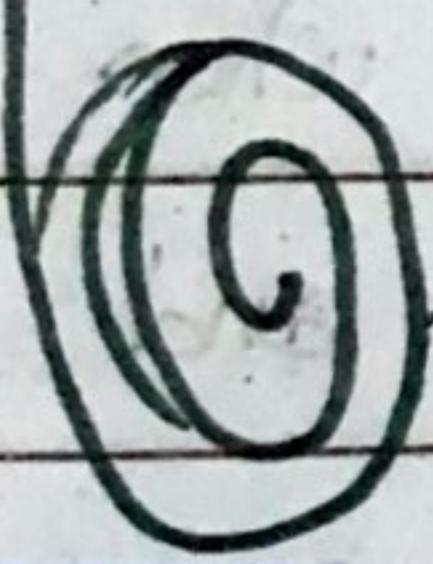
The Text Successfully presented the true picture of Foreman struggle
