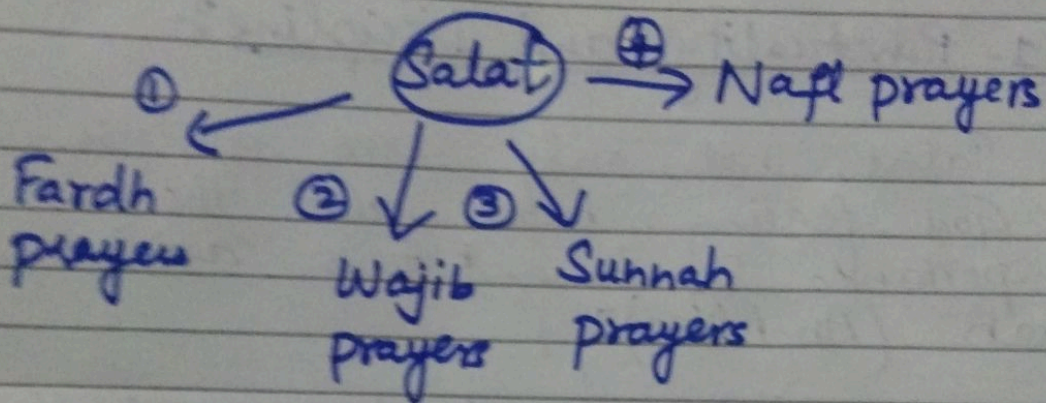
Salah (Prayer):-

All human beings by birth are equal. It is the duty of the Islamic State to ensure that all citizens enjoy equal opportunities, and a fair chance to earn their livelihood. For this purpose, Islam has provided us with a socio-economic system. This system is ~~the~~ called as Zakat.

Zakat:-



Zakat is derived from an Arabic word meaning 'purification'. Its implied meaning refers to the purification of one's wealth for the socio-economic benefit of society. The Holy Prophet said:

"Allah has made Zakat obligatory on you for this very reason that the remaining wealth of yours may become pure for you."

## • Postulates of Socio-Economic System of Islam :-

### 1. Nisab of Zakat :-

It refers to the amount of zakat which is the minimum or standard amount that can be paid on a material possession.



### Nisab:-

Type of Possession	Nisab of Zakat
Money / Income	2.5%
Silver	52.5 tolas
Gold	7.5 tolas (302g)
Camel	5 camels
Goat	40 goats
Cow	3 cows
Land produce	10% (on rainy lands)
	5% on artificially irrigated land.

## 2- Distribution of Zakat:-

### I- Beneficiaries of Zakat / Masarif:

The Holy Quran highlights that who are eligible for Zakat:-

66 Alms are only for the poor and the needy, and the official over them, and those whose hearts are made to incline and the captives and those



in debts and in the way of Allah and the wayfarer; an ordinance from Allah; and Allah is Knowing, Wise."

However, zakat cannot be given to:

- 1- Masajid and hospitals
- 2- Aaal-e-Muhammads)
- 3- Parents and Children.

It is the organization from where zakat is distributed ~~into~~ ~~the~~ to the masarif-e-zakat.

It goes through three phases:-

- 2- Stored at ~~the~~ Bait ul Maal
- 3- ~~Diff~~ Distribution in Society,

Zakat helps to ensure the eradication of poverty as it takes the surplus wealth



from the rich annual and distributes it to the poor. In this way wealth is distributed ~~in~~ in a circular manner in society which leads to economic stability and this ~~is~~ stability also brings social values where the poor is rescued from doing crimes for fulfilling his hunger and the rich's lust of ~~the~~ wealth is reduced.

### a) - Rights of Non-Combatants:-

According to Abu Dawud, the Prophet (s) once said:-

### b) Rights of Combatants:-

Islam wants a peaceful



approach even in war:-

- First of all, war should be announced before attack,
- According to Bukhari, the Prophet has prohibited the believers from looting and plundering in war.
- The corpses of enemies should not be mutilated.
