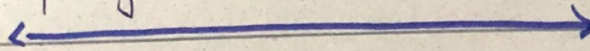

5. I wish I could go back to earlier times.

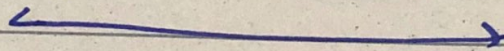
8. Sir Majid not only grill a steak for Sir Azhar, but he also cooked biryani for Sir Shahab.
