1. Introduction:

Zakat (charity) is the fourth pillar of Islam. It plays a crucial role in Islamic Society. Its importance can be manifested from this that, like Salat (prayers), it is also mentioned several times in Holy Quran. It helps integrate a society through poverty alleviation, controlling inflation, and mutual cooperation.

2 Meaning of Zakat:-

(A) Literal Meaning:

Literally the word zakat means to purify or get purified.

(B) Contextual Meaning:

In Islamic context, the meaning of zakat is to cleanse/purify one's wealth by giving away its fixed portion with regard to the commandments of Allah.

(C) Who are the receivers of Zakat?

There are eight Masafat (receivers) of Zakat according to Holy Quran who can get the Islamic charity. As the verse goes on

”اَلَّا اِذَا حِصْرَافَتِ لِلْفُقَرَاءِ وَلِمُسَاكِينِ
وَالْعَامِلِينَ حَلَّبَيْهَا وَلِمُحْلِفَاتِ قَلْوَبِ
فِي الرَّقَابِ وَالْخَارِجِينَ وَفِي سِيرِ
اللَّلَّٰهِ وَرِبِّ اسْبَلٍ“
(Al-Tawba: 60)

“These charities are for the poor, needy, the collectors of Zakat, the new converts, to release prisoners, slaves, the indebted, for the cause of Allah and to wayfarers.”

E) ③ Role of Zakat in poverty Alleviation:

Zakat has an immense importance in Islam and its economic system, as it helps alleviate poverty from society. There are various rationales on which one can easily say that Zakat helps in poverty alleviation.

(A) Zakat is taken from wealthy and given to poor:-

It is mentioned in an Hadith, quoted by prophet (PBUH),

”وَتَرْدُ لِلْفُقَرَاءِ مِنْ أَمْوَالِ الْأَغْنِيَاءِ“

“It is taken from the affluence”

ones and given to destitute.

Hence, by distributing the wealth of rich to the poor helps in alleviating poverty.

(B) Mandatory on each able Muslim:-

Zakat helps in poverty alleviation as it is mandatory on every able Muslim. Therefore, the donations by rich people substantiates the lives of down trodden part of society.

(C) Circulation of Wealth:-

Zakat is a good and natural way of circulating the wealth. Hence, by circulation of wealth, hoarding is discouraged. This, automatically helps in controlling inflation and poverty in a society.

(D) Establishment of classless Society:

⇒ paying zakat helps in establishing a classless society, where affluent people cooperate and help the down trodden part of society to uplift them economically. Hence, zakat helps in poverty alleviation till the establishment of a classless society.

5. Conclusion:

Zakat, being fourth pillar in Islamic injunctions, shows

an immense importance. It is good in several perspectives; however, its utmost benefit is that it helps in poverty alleviation and establishment of a welfare state.

several prophets for the guidance
of people and believing in all
of them is mandatory for
every Muslim. Moreover, after
prophet Muhammad (PBUH) the
noble profession of prophethood
came to an end. As Allah
(SWT) states. "

جَاءَكُم مِّنْ رَّبِّكُمْ رَّحْمَةً وَّخَاتُمَ النُّبُوُّتِ
وَالْأَئِمَّةُ مِنْ بَنِي إِلَٰهٖكُمْ مُّصَدِّقٌ لِّمَا
بَيْنَ أَيْمَانِكُمْ وَلَا يُنَزَّلُ عَلَيْكُمْ

"Muhammad (PBUH) is not the
father of any one of you, but
the apostle of Allah, and
a Seal to prophethood."
(Al-Quran)

3. Impacts of Doctrine of Prophethood:-

Main impacts of doctrine
of prophethood are as follows.

(A) Impacts on individual life:

(i) Character building:

Belief in Prophethood helps in character building. As the holy Quran says that

”الْجَنَّةُ لِمَنْ يَعْبُدُ“
“جَنَّةُ الْمُسْلِمِ”

“Indeed, the life of prophet is best example for you.”

(Al-Quran)

(ii) Guidance to right path:-

Allah has sent hundreds of prophets for the sole purpose of guiding the people to right path. Without prophets, one is unable to interpret the holy scriptures, and understand ones ways to spend life. These are the prophets which interpret the Islamic injunctions and guide us throughout the life.

(iii) Living a purposeful life:-

prophets tell us the purpose of our creation that why we have been created. Hence, people extricate themselves from materialism and acquire spiritualistic ideals. These spiritualistic values render them live a purposeful life.

(iv) Hope and optimism:-

All the prophets have come to warn the people about punishments as well as rewards on which are delivered on day of judgment. Therefore, people involve themselves in good conducts — mentioned by prophets — and become optimistic for their future rewards.

(B) Impacts on Collective Life:-

Doctrine of prophethood also shows & multifarious impacts on society. Main impacts on society are hereunder:

- (i) Ensuring brotherhood and fraternity:
To believe in prophet helps build ties of brotherhood ~~ma~~ among the people living in a society
- (ii) Unity and discipline:-
Prophets mostly preached about unity and discipline. They nullified the discriminations of each kind. Hence, ^{between them} prophet hood promotes Unity among the followers.
- (iii) Promotion of social justice:-
All prophets talked about equality before law, whether one is poor or rich, one is powerful or powerless, one is master or slave, all are equal, before

before law. Hence, doctrine of prophet helps in promotion of justice.

(iv) Establishment of pluralistic society;

Doctrine of prophethood helps in establishing of a pluralistic society where all people cooperate, and help each other. They respect each other and their values.

(v) Promotion of peace and harmony; -

peace and harmony prevails in a society where people are bound to moral values, where exists rule of law, and social coexistence.

As all these values are ensured by believing in prophethood, thus it helps in establishment of a peaceful society.

4. Conclusion:

To put at a finishing stroke, prophet doctrine of prophethood is pivotal in Islam as it is part of belief. Similarly, its importance cannot be neglected when it comes to impacts of belief in prophethood on the lives of individuals and the people living in a society.
