Q#02 Social Institution

A social institution is an organized entity that brings together different elements of a society to inculcate or teach sociological norms. It permeates society on many levels and determines the trajectory of evolution of a society.

• Role of institutions

Right from the beginning of times institutions have brought together social individuals on the basis of normative similarities. They are structures that organically rise from pools of societies with a command and consensus on morality, ways of living and future goals. There would be no civilization if it was not for these institutions. Following is an assessment of the role played by some key institutions of any society:

⇒ Families - The first school of learning

⇒ Educational Institutions
