I. Introduction:

The Muslims were moving away from the religious practices and teachings when the religious reformers came to the limelight. The muslims had worst political, economic, and social conditions. Sheikh Ahmad Sirhindi, Shah Waliullah and Syed Ahmad Shaheed had a deep political, social, and economic impacts on the muslims of that time that helped to reshape the muslim identity in United India. Aligarh Movement was also the effort placed by the Syed Ahmad Khan that played an instrumental role in forming

the political ideal of muslims in 20th century. Moreover,

there were also some other movements taking place

after it which were Deobandi movement and Nadwa movement.

II - INFLUENCE OF RELIGIOUS REFORMERS IN SHAPING MUSLIM IDENTITY IN UNITED INDIA

The Three important Religious reformers have played a significant role in shaping the muslim identity in United India.

II-A SHEIKH AHMAD SIRHINDI

II-A (i) Conditions of Muslims at that time:

a - Akbar introduced Din-e-Illahi, a new religion, that proved detrimental to the muslims as they forgot the Islamic teachings under the teachings of Quran and sunnah.

b - Un-Islamic practices were common under the influence of Hindus.

c - Authenticity of sharia was denied and jurisprudence was considered as only the real knowledge.

d - The Ulamas of that time declared un-Islamic practices such as gambling, liquor, eating in Ramadhan as halal.

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II-A(iii) Services of Sheikh Ahmad Sirhindi

II A(iii)(a)

Sheikh Send a number of disciplines to various areas of India

Sheikh Ahmad Sirhindi send a number of disciplines to various parts of India to teach the real Islamic knowledge according to Quran and Sunnah. They also stressed the people to follow Sunnah.

II A(iii)(b) Concept of Wahdatul Shahad was

The concept of Wahdatul Wahood was prevalent at that time that was described as that every being of the God is God itself. So, Sheikh Ahmad Sirhindi denied that concept and gave the concept of Wahdat-ul-Wajood that holds that God and His creation are entirely separate.

II A(iii)(c) Opposition of Din-e-Illahi

Sheikh Ahmad Sirhindi also opposed the Din-e-Illahi introduced by Mughal Emperor Akbar. He exposed its fallacy through forceful articles and predicted its dangerous effect for the future generation.

II A ~~Right~~ Rectification in Mysticism

Sheikh Ahmad Sirhindi explained the fact that mysticism without Shariah is a misleading concept.

He told the difference between Wilayat and Nabuwat. He corrected the different opinions between the Sainthood and Nabuwat and tried to rectify the unislamic principles in mysticism.

II-A (iii) Sheikh Ahmad Sirhindi and Two

At that time, there was a joint system of nationalism. Sheikh Ahmad Sirhindi advocated the separateness and exclusiveness of the Muslims. He adopted a stern action towards Hindus. It shows that he was the pioneer of Two-Nation Theory.

II Bii) Services of Shah Waliullah

II Bii)(a) Translation of Holy Quran into

Persian

Shah Waliullah translated the Quran into Persian so that Muslims will be able to learn the Quran and its teachings with more ease.

II Bii)(b) Political Services of Shah

Waliullah wrote a letter to Shah Abdali, King of Afghanistan to save the muslims from the influence of Marathas. Marathas has become a great political power at that time, in the 18th century, and tried to take control over whole Delhi. So, with the help of Ahmad Shah Abdali, he was successful to defeat the Marathas and saved the muslims.

The main reorienting the muslim society with the concept of basic social justice, removing social inequality and balance the unequal distribution of wealth. He pinpointed the causes of chaos of muslim society in his book, *Tajjat - Ulch - il-Baqiyah* that there must be no taxation heavily imposed on peasants and workers and there must be no concentration of wealth in few hands.

II-C Syed Ahmad Shahid

III. How did Aligarh Movement remain SUCCESSFUL IN FORMING

POLITICAL IDEALS OF MUSLIMS

Aligarh Movement was basically an educational venture but it had deep political impacts. It was

a movement launched by Sir Syed Ahmad Khan and later it was carried by his juniors and colleagues.

III (i) Literary writings of Sir Syed

Ahmad Khan:

Sir Syed Ahmad Khan's literary writings such as "The cause of Indian Revolt" and "Loyal Mohammedans of India" etc were a remarkable writings that helped to remove the rift between the Muslims and British and later helped the Muslims to achieve their political rights.

II (iii) Sacred Urdu in Hindi-Urdu

~~and religious~~ Controversy:

Hindi-Urdu controversy was emerged in that time. The Hindus demanded that Hindi should be their official language. On the other hand, the Muslims wanted to save their language, Urdu. That Hindi-Urdu controversy emerged the concept of Two-Nation Theory and enforced Sir Syed, who were staunch believers of Hindu-Muslim unity, to say that Hindus and muslims are two nations and they can't live under the same roof.

II (iv) Opposition of Congress

Sir Syed Ahmad Khan was opposed to Congress and instructed muslims to stay away from that because he knew that Congress was a Hindu dominated party and it will not protect the muslims rights.

II (v) All Indian Educational Congress

became a launching pad of All Indian Muslim League.

All Indian Educational Congress was not basically an educational institute. But there were

no political platform for the muslims. So, AIEC was become a platform to discuss the muslimi political, and social problems. Later, the inauguration of All Indian Muslim League was announced in ~~the~~ one of the conferences of AIEC.

II-V Focus of Western education

Sir Syed Ahmad Khan had the view that the fundamental rights of the muslims could not be protected unless they get western education. So, he made different schools, colleges and organizations to disseminate the western education to muslims. Later, with the scaling of western education, the muslims were able to get the jobs in the government services and got their political rights as well.
