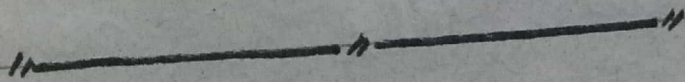
Answer #4:

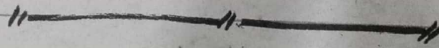
