Discuss different theories of gender based violence. What form of violence is more prevalent in Pakistan and how it can be eradicated?

Ans

Various theories address gender-based violence (GBV), including feminist theories, social learning theories, and ecological models. In Pakistan different forms of gender-based violence prevail, such as domestic violence, honor, kill, killings and sexual harassment.

To address gender-based violence in Pakistan,

1) Legal Reforms

Strengthen and enforce laws against gender-based violence, ensuring that perpetrators are held accountable.

(2) Education and Awareness: Promote gender equality through educational programs that challenge traditional gender roles.

(3) Empowerment Programs: Support initiatives that empower women economically, socially and politically. This can include skills training, access to education, and promoting women's participation in decision-making processes.

(4) Media Responsibility: Promote responsible media reporting that refrains from sensationalizing violence and instead highlights stories of empowerment and change.

Combating gender-based violence requires a comprehensive effort involving government agencies, civil society and the community.
